Mr. Speaker, I rise today to honor Katie Dasinger of Sidney for her efforts to engage young professionals in Eastern Montana to serve their communities and develop their skills.

Dasinger is founder and president of Sidney Young Professionals (SYP), a group focused on community service as well as personal and professional development. The program coordinator for the Richland Economic Development Corporation (REDC) in Sidney, Dasinger launched SYP in 2016.

SYP recently held its annual winter school benefit which was dedicated to helping teachers replenish their classrooms with supplies, equipment, and other items for the new school semester. SYP collected more than 25 large shopping bags of supplies as well as donations from the public and local businesses.

SYP regularly organizes entrepreneurship panels, roundtable discussions, public forums, training programs, and tours of area businesses.

When a court ruling threatened the Lower Yellowstone Irrigation Project (LYIP) at nearby Intake, SYP and REDC coordinated bus tours, organized educational outreach, and bolstered community support for the vital irrigation project. Their efforts contributed to a positive outcome for the thousands of area residents who rely on the LYIP to irrigate crops and provide water for their municipal systems.

"We want to engage young adults to invest in their communities, get to know the local business and community leaders, serve on local boards, and take part in community events. It's important young people have a reason to stay connected to the area," said Dasinger, who Montana Young Professionals recognized as the Young Professional Woman of the Year for 2018.

Watford City Voters to Decide on New Elementary School Questions Jan. 8

McKenzie County voters will decide whether to approve or deny two requests designed to fund upcoming anticipated needs of the school district.

Question one asks residents to approve a general obligation bond in an amount up to 35 million dollars, for the purpose of providing funds necessary to construct a new elementary school. It will raise millage an additional 13 mills, which is equal to \$13 dollars on each thousand dollars of taxable valuation for the first taxable year.

Question two asks residents to approve an increase of its school Building Fund Levy from 10 mills to 20 in order to approve additional anticipated building needs.

The Roundup spoke with Shilo Chavez, who works with the 'Vote Yes Committee,' which is advocating for the passage of both questions on the ballot. Chavez has lived in Watford City for about a year and a half, and is a parent volunteer. She explained the purpose of the committee.

Chavez explained, "The 'Vote Yes Committee' is trying to get the word out about an upcoming vote we have on January 8 in McKenzie

County. There's going to be two questions on the ballot. The first question addresses the school that was approved by the school board and the bond that we need to build that school. The second question addresses the future challenges the school will have. Our projections currently show that by the time the new school is built, we will likely be at capacity again. The second question deals with this, saying that in the event we reach capacity and need a third elementary school we can go ahead and increase the building fund mill levy from 10 to 20, so we can address the needs for a new school in the future."

When asked why, if the new elementary school being built is not expected to be sufficient in size, why not just build a bigger school to begin with, Chavez asserted that to do so wasn't a practical solution.

"We've had that asked," Chavez said. "One, studies have shown that kids learn better in a smaller environment. Kids do better in a smaller school. We don't want them to feel like they're lost in a crowd in a big school. But also, it doesn't make sense to do a bigger building especially for an elementary school because parents' pick-up and drop-off becomes a nightmare. Also, in regards to a cafeteria,

it's difficult. Right now we have kids eating as early as 10:40 a.m. and others as late as 12:40 p.m., and with more kids in one facility it would become that much more difficult logistically."

According to Chavez, there aren't many vocally opposing the initiatives.

"I've not talked to anyone who is actively encouraging people to vote against it. We have had some negative comments on the Facebook page questioning lay out and design," Chavez reported.

Chavez also claimed that taxpayer burden would not be exorbitant should the two ballot initiatives pass.

Williston Born Author Writes New Teton Novel "Stories Of The Mother Bear" A Life Journey Across The Miles

BROOKLYN, N.Y. - When author Myrtle Brooks spent an overnight under the stars in Grand Teton National Park in 1967, it was one stop along a cross-country camping trip.

Forty-three years later, she packed up her 1999 Dodge

Caravan and made the drive herself. Upon entering Teton for the second time, she experienced the land's hearty welcome. "Like a big, old mother bear," she remarked. Thus, her historical fantasy, Stories of the Mother Bear, Black Rose Writing, began. In Jackson, Wyoming, a cache of documents discovered in a deceased resident's attic confirms a childhood vision journalist Bill Larkin experienced while on a camping trip in Grand Teton. Learning his memories of a mother grizzly, who transforms the lives of those who cross her path, were not imaginary, Bill embarks on a life journey, intertwining his autobiographical Stories of the Mother Bear with current events; foremost, the Vietnam War and its aftermath. The deceased, Rufus Headrick, and his family were black cowboys. His grandfather, a freed slave, kept a journal from his days as a Texas cattle hand through the family's ever-westward travels to Teton. Portrayed is a large, engraved brass key, yet to be found, which a Kiowa youth gave Rufus' father along the Chisholm Trail. Who is the estate's rightful heir? And what connection does the Headrick Family have with the Mother Bear?

A little ways along the main road after the Teton entrance, I pulled the bus over to the curb, opened the door and emerged to look around me. "It's... that I feel I've been here my whole

life. As though it's a place I've known for all time." "Is it because it's scenic?" Jesse sought me eagerly. "It's because... I've returned home."

Notwithstanding, Brooks' Western includes more than a nod to the city of her origin in relation to the pristine, defined majesty of Teton.

"I get the same feeling here in New York as I do the mountains; it's as if... the skyscrapers are on the same level metaphorically. There's that perfection, that ordered pattern as in nature. Or, I'm a candidate for... the hospital here with the mental ward..." "Bellevue." She shook her head. "I get that sense of euphoria every time I return here. So many New Yorkers visit the West. It's a dream of theirs to see the land where the cowboy pictures are filmed; to get themselves dizzy taking in the thin mountain air; to unfold their sleeping bags under the stars someplace where there's no civilization around for miles. I'm a Westerner, born in Williston, North Dakota. I come to New York."

Volunteer Tax-Aide Counselors Needed In Richland County

The Richland County Commission on Aging, in coordination with the AARP Foundation, is seeking volunteers interested in assisting older, low income individuals with preparing and filing their taxes. Volunteers make a big difference in their communities by helping those people who might otherwise miss out on the tax credits and deductions they've earned. Felicia Iversen and Jodi Berry of the Commission state that this is a needed service in this area as they get multiple calls every year asking for assistance.

Volunteers are trained and certified to do tax preparation. There is no liability; volunteers are covered through AARP. They are expected to work primarily from February 1 through April 15 for up to four hours per week, depending on demand.

Americorps volunteers are providing tax services this year and AARP has already sent computers and other necessary equipment.

As program specialist, Iversen has worked for months to get this beneficial service up and running and is in need of volunteers who would be ready for the next tax season in 2020. It could be a great use of the time and talents of those over 50 who are looking to help others, but any adult is welcome.

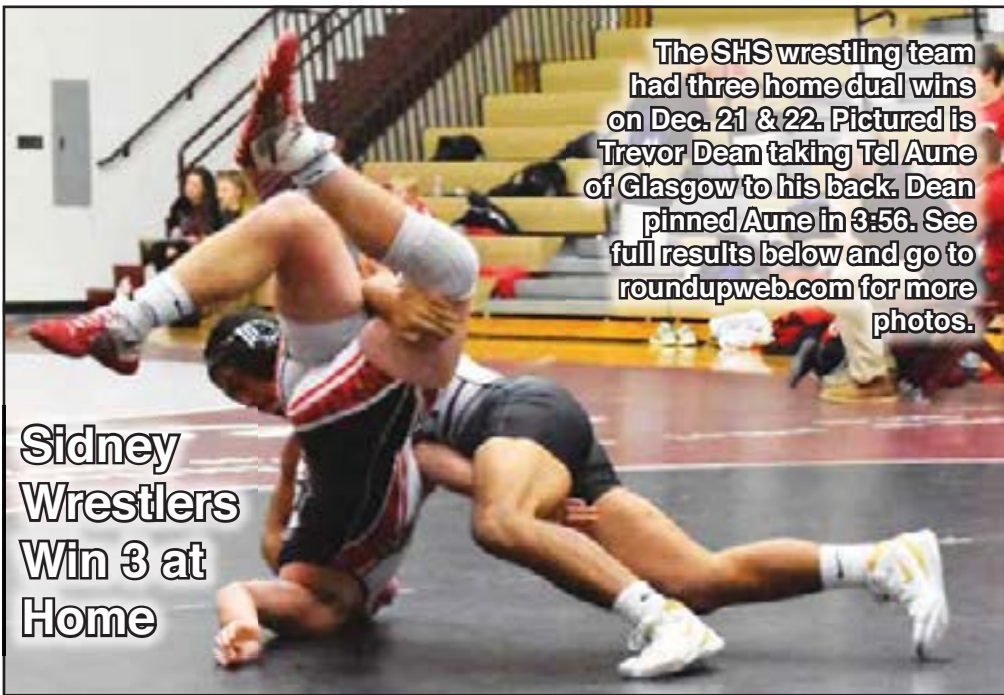

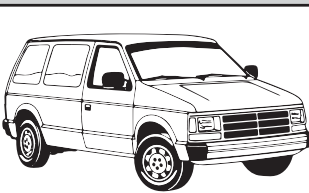
