NDRA Rodeo Slated For Sept. 24-25 In Watford City

This year, the McKenzie County Cowboys Association will be hosting the North Dakota Rodeo Association Championship Finals Rodeo at the McKenzie County Fairgrounds, Watford City, on Friday, Sept. 24 and Saturday, Sept. 25. The rodeo will start at 7 p.m. on Friday

and 6 p.m. on Saturday. The NDRA Rodeo will include a rodeo dance, The Mud Butte Band, a ranch rodeo, and vendors.

The Finals Rodeo will feature the top contestants in each standard event and pit them against the top stock in the state. Events that will be at the finals rodeo is

bareback and saddle bronc riding, lady's breakaway and barrels, men's breakaway and bull riding, team roping, steer wrestling, and tie-down roping. Saturday afternoon there will also be a ranch rodeo that local contestants will participate in.

The rodeo will feature a kids boot race, a wild ride at each performance, vendors, beer gardens, and concessions.

The NDRA is one of North Dakota's largest rodeo entities. It was formed in 1953 and is made up of over 500 members that compete in rodeos across the state of North Dakota. The NDRA puts on 15-25 rodeos a

year. The association averages about 200 cowboys and cowgirls from Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wyoming, Nebraska, and Minnesota per rodeo.

Everyone is encouraged to come out and watch rodeo finalists compete for the 2021 NDRA Championship state titles!

E-Waste Collection Sept 24-25 Sidney **Fairview**

The 17th annual "Erase your Ewaste" event gets underway in Sidney this coming Friday, Sept. 24 from 3-7 p.m. at the Richland County Public Shop next to the fairgrounds. MonDak area residents...not just Richland County...are encouraged to bring their obsolete or damaged electronic items for recycling in both Sidney and Fairview this weekend, according to Event Coordinator Heather Luinstra.

Sidney's event begins Friday and then continues from 9 a.m.-noon on Saturday, Sept. 25. Fairview's event will be Saturday only from 10 a.m.-noon, at the water depot on 9th Street.

Yellowstone E-waste Solutions out of Billings is the e-cycler for the event and continues to offer their services for free The only exception is a \$7 charge for removing a hard drive for those needing certificates of destruction or just wanting to hang on to them.

Large Loads

As in past years, local businesses, hospitals, school and other agencies and organizations with large amounts to e-cycle are asked to make an appointment by calling Luinstra at Richland County Health Department 406-433-2207 or emailing hluinstra@richland.org.

Unacceptable Items

No CRT (tube) televisions or monitors are being accepted and no projection TV units or consoles. Other limitations include no consumer white goods, vacuums, light bulbs, CFLs, mercury thermometers, alkaline batteries (rechargeable are okay), or items containing refrigerants (including de-

humidifiers), oils, or acids. The "E-rase your E-waste" effort has recycled more than half a million pounds of ewaste (255 tons) since its inception in 2005. The event is coordinated by members of the Richland County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC), Richland County Disaster and Emergency Services, and Richland County Health Department. The Richland County Public Works Department also makes their facilities freely available for the collection





Flu Myths... **Busted**!

There are so many myths about the flu and the flu shot all over the Internet, so in preparation for the Drive Thru Mass Flu Shot Clinic at Richland County Fire Hall, Sept. 30, we've busted a few myths wide open.

The first, and biggest, myth is that the flu went away. Unfortunately, that isn't true. While it is true that there were no cases of influenza reported in the 2020-2021 flu season, scientists and public health professionals believe that our actions to protect against the spread of COVID-19 also protected us from the flu. Both diseases are respiratory infections that are prevented by hand-washing, mask-wearing and social distancing. Since we are doing less mask-wearing and less social distancing (and hopefully equally as much hand-washing!) we expect to see positive flu cases during the 2021-2022 flu season.

The second biggest myth is that the flu shot contains the COVID-19 vaccine as well. This is also not true-the flu vaccine and the COVID-19 vaccine remains separate vaccines. The flu vaccine offered by the Health Department protects against four strains of influenza. The COVID-19 vaccine protects only against COVID-19 infection, and is not offered at the Mass Flu Shot Clinic.

The third biggest myth worth busting is that COVID-19 is actually just the regular seasonal flu with a new name. This is also not true. The two are separate and genetically different viruses that may produce similar symptoms. Therefore, the two viruses are prevented with two different vaccines. Because they are two different viruses, it is possible to become infected with both.

There are many reasons to get your flu shot this flu season. If you have questions or need help with the decision to get you and your family vaccinated against the flu, contact the Health Department at 406-433-2207.

The Richland County Health Department will be holding its annual Mass Flu Shot Clinic as a drive-thru at the Richland County Fire Hall, Sept. 30, from 10 a.m.-6 p.m. The Drive-Thru Clinic will serve adults only, and offers both regular and high-dose flu shots. No other shots will be given during the clinic. No COVID-19 vaccine will be given. No appointment is needed. Flu shots cannot be given to those who have animals in their vehicles. Children may be in the vehicle, but may not receive flu shots. Follow traffic signs to enter the Fire Hall from the north side.

Do not attend the clinic if you are not feeling well. Do not attend if you are waiting for test results from a COVID-19 test. Do not attend if you have COVID-19 or have been exposed to COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

Flu shots, as well as other vaccines, for children and families will be available during regular clinic hours, on Monday and Wednesday, 10 a.m.-4:30 p.m. by appointment. Additional clinic hours are the second Wednesday until 6 p.m., and the third Thursday of the month, from 1-4 p.m. by appointment. COVID-19 vaccines are available on Tuesdays from 12:30-3 p.m. without appointment. Check the Department Facebook page at www.facebook.com/ RichlandCountyHealthDepartment for changes to regular





Amber Severson Completes National Endowment For The Humanities Workshop

The Heart Mountain Wyoming Foundation is pleased to announce that Amber Severson, a social studies teacher at Alexander Public School, Alexander, ND, successfully completed our workshop for educators this summer sponsored by the National Endowment for the Humanities.

"Heart Mountain, Wyoming, and the Japanese American Incarceration" taught a total of 72 educators over two weeks about the incarceration of 120,000 Japanese Americans during World War II and the related issues of the treatment of Native Americans, the

racism behind many government decisions and the settling of the American West.

During each week-long workshop, 36 educators from around the country participated in the virtual program that was part of NEH's Landmarks of American History and Culture series. All participants received a \$1,300 stipend from NEH and a certificate noting their successful completion of the

program.

In surveys conducted by the Heart Mountain Wyoming Foundation and National Humanities Alliance, participants called the workshops transformative and essential to their future teaching of this critical part of American history.

MSU To Offer Pest Management Tour Across Eastern Montana In October

By MSU News Service

Bozeman —The Montana State University Pesticide Education Program, with assistance from the Montana Department of Agriculture, is offering a pest management tour for pesticide applicators at 10 locations across eastern Montana from Oct. 4-8.

Those in the state's Private Applicator Training District 4 need to earn six private applicator credits before Dec. 31 to avoid losing their certification, according to MSU Extension Pesticide Education Specialist Cecil Tharp. District 4 includes Carter, Custer, Daniels, Dawson, Fallon, Garfield, McCone, Phillips, Powder River, Prairie, Richland, Roosevelt, Rosebud, Sheridan, Treasure, Valley and Wibaux counties. Applicators can check their credits at https://mtplants.mt.gov/ PesticideApplicator/ApplicationExternalSearch.aspx or contact their county MSU Extension office for license information.

There will be 10 onsite

locations total, two for each day. Speakers will present a variety of topics, including managing rodents; managing herbicide-resistant weeds; drought considerations when using pesticides; drought and weed management; preventing weed spread from hay shipments; and more. Presentations vary by location.

Representatives speaking on the tour include Tharp; MSU Extension Forage Specialist Hayes Goosey; MSU Crop Weed Specialist Tim Seipel; MSU Associate Extension Specialist Noelle Orloff; MSU Associate Extension Plant Pathologist Uta McKelvy; and MDA Vertebrate Pest Specialist Stephen Vantassel.

Private applicators can attend morning or afternoon sessions for three credits or both sessions for six credits. More information, including commercial applicator credits, can be found at https://pesticides.montana.edu/events/2021pmt.html.

All locations will follow MSU and Centers for Dis-

ease Control and Prevention policies requesting mask use while indoors. Individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 in the two weeks prior to the event or who are experiencing cold-or flu-like symptoms should not attend.


