# Arnegard: Future Home To Over 1400 Bakken Workers

Coming soon to Arnegard, heart of the Bakken in McKenzie County, is the largest crew lodge offering a full meal service program to its guests along with many other amenities. The InstaLodge Centre will sit on 160 acres on HWY 85 – just 45 minutes south of Williston and 6 miles west of Watford City. It'll be a state-of-the-art facility offering its guest all of the comforts of home plus so much more.

With the depressed economy in many states, many people have no other option but to live and work away from home to support their families. InstaLodge takes pride in providing clean, modern, comfortable rooms and amenities to their guests in hopes of making their time away from home and family easier.



The MonDak Stockgrower's Association held their meeting Monday, November 19th. They discussed many issues in the industry and had two main guest speakers. The speakers were Dr. Jude Capper and Julie Ellingson.

Following dinner, Errol Rice, Executive Vice President of the Montana Stockgrowers Association spoke briefly on the advancements in the organization. He also spoke about the new book, Big Sky Boots. The first in the five-part Montana Family Ranching Series: a photographic story-telling project of the Montana Stockgrowers Association. In "Big Sky Boots" readers can journey through the ranching years and learn about the great people that take care of the land, live-stock and their families. This first book focuses on the cowboys themselves; the men and the seasons. Books can be purchased on their website at www.mtbeef.org.

Julie Ellingson, the executive vice president for the ND Stockmen's Association spoke on Measure 5. She explained what it was and how it would affect the beef industry.

Jude Capper, independent Sustainabilty Consultant, spoke on the myths that the social media is portraying about the beef industry and the scientific facts that have been discovered. She compared the two and it showed that the calculations were not even close. Capper has done a few studies, one of which found that "Cattle born on Montana ranches supply 12.2 million people with safe, affordable, nutritious beef every single year."

Following the speakers, the annual awards were handed out. The Ranch of the Year went to the Haugen Ranch, while the Business of the Year went to High Plains Vet Clinic.



# **Burning Season Ends November 30**

The fall open burning season ends on November 30, 2012. No open burning is allowed in the Western Montana Burn Zone until March 1, 2013, unless specific permission is obtained from the Montana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). The Western Montana Burn Zone includes the following Counties: Lincoln, Flathead, Sanders, Lake, Mineral, Missoula, Powell, Lewis and Clark, Ravalli, Granite, Deer Lodge, Silver Bow, Jefferson, Broadwater, Beaverhead, Madison, Gallatin, and that portion south of I-90 in Park.

Open burning sources located in the Eastern Montana Open Burning Zone who wish to conduct open burning during the winter months must notify the DEQ by telephone prior to ignition at (406) 444-3490. Residents of Lewis and Clark, Yellowstone, Flathead, Missoula, Lincoln, and Cascade counties and all Indian reservations should contact their local air quality agency to understand local level air quality related open burning rules.


Archery deer, sharp-tailed and ruffed grouse, partridge, pheasant and tree squirrel hunting seasons continue through Jan. 6, 2013.

The fall turkey season closes Jan. 13, 2013.





# Hello Winter

# So You Think You Are Ready For Another Montana Winter?

Such a magical time of year...clean, crisp innocent winter. HA HA HA! Oh don't get me wrong...what's more fun than a snowball fight with sons and grandsons or making snow angels in the snow with your daughters and grand-daughters. But let's not forget it's COLD! We are not talking about the cold that forces us to wear long sleeves and pants again but the kind of cold that makes your nostrils stick together when you open your front door...the kind that creates icicles that hang from the tip of your nose...that's a "Montana Winter".

We Montanans have adapted over the years...we will joke about the temperatures and the depth of the snow and tell stories of years past....but we know what we are in for each year. We know that failing to respect the cold, snow and wind is no laughing matter. We have spent our lives here and know how to prepare...BUT...after last year's mild winter, are we really ready if we get a "real Montana Winter"? If you are new to the area and haven't experienced a Montana winter...do you know how to prepare?

It could be 50 above one day and 30 below with winds blowing just as fast the next...that day is not the day to think about preparing. Here are just a few things that we all need to remember:

Frostbite is serious...good outerwear should be the first thing you should purchase. Look for items that protect you to temps well below zero, wet snows and the wind...boots, coats, hats, gloves and snow pants. If you and your loved ones will be outside make sure they have protective wear that will cover all exposed skin. Have fun and enjoy the winter but know the warning signs of hypothermia and frostbite. For more information contact: www. Emergency.cdc.gov/disasters/winter/faq.asp

Your home also needs attention prior to winter settling in...our "Montana Winters" last a while. Because your home will be the warm spot for you and your loved ones, make sure it is ready and safe. Everyone should have a working carbon monoxide and smoke detector. Any heater that uses a fuel source can give off the poisonous, undetectable gas. Do not make alterations to a heat source or use one that is not recommended for the task it is being used for. Make sure your doors and windows keep out the cold and wind...cover them if needed but keep in mind you may need them for an emergency exit. Make sure your pipes are exposed to warm air, wrapped with heat tape or remain dripping in extreme cold temperatures. Check your ventilation systems and keep the free of snow and ice. Keep your entrances and walk way free of snow and ice, falling in cold temperature and not being able to get up could cost a life. Keep survival supplies on hand...your home could be your shelter for a few days or more during one of our "Montana Winters". For more specific information go to state of Montana at http://mdt.mt.gov/safety/ You can also download or order Montana Disaster & Emergency Survival Guide.

The temperatures will affect your vehicle... Get it winterized before winter starts. Install a block heater if it doesn't have one, check your coolant levels and antifreeze, battery, tires, breaks, lights, and wipers. Switch to winter fuel if you drive a diesel or add an additive if you drive a gas vehicle each time you fill. Your vehicle could be your life line; make sure it is ready for a "Montana Winter". Contact a vehicle service business to assure your vehicle is ready.

Here are some tips from the National Safety Council for driving safely on icy roads:

1. Decrease your speed and leave yourself plenty of room to stop. You should allow at least three times more space than usual between you and the car in front of you.

2. Brake gently to avoid skidding. If your wheels start to lock up, ease off the brake.

3. Don't use cruise control or overdrive on icy roads.

4. Be especially careful on bridges, overpasses and infrequently traveled roads, which will freeze first. Even at temperatures above freezing, if the conditions are wet, you might encounter ice in shady areas or on exposed roadways like bridges.

- 5. Don't pass snow plows and sanding trucks. The drivers have limited visibility, and you're likely to find the road in front of them worse than the road behind.
- 6. Turn on your lights to increase your visibility to other
  - 7. Keep your lights and windshield clean.
  - 8. Use low gears to keep traction, especially on hills.
- 9. Don't assume your vehicle can handle all conditions. Even four-wheel and front-wheel drive vehicles can encounter trouble on winter roads.
  - 10. Allow extra time to arrive at your destination.
  - If your rear wheels skid:
  - 1. Take your foot off the accelerator.

2. Steer in the direction you want the front wheels to go. If your rear wheels are sliding left, steer left. If they're sliding right, steer right.

3. If your rear wheels start sliding the other way as you recover, ease the steering wheel toward that side. You might have to steer left and right a few times to get your vehicle completely under control.

4. If you have standard brakes, pump them gently.

5. If you have anti-lock brakes (ABS), do not pump the brakes. Apply steady pressure to the brakes. You will feel the brakes pulse this is normal.

If your front wheels skid:

1. Take your foot off the gas and shift to neutral, but don't try to steer immediately.

2. As the wheels skid sideways, they will slow the vehicle and traction will return. As it does, steer in the direction you want to go. Then put the transmission in "drive" or release the clutch, and accelerate gently.

- 7. Whistle to signal for help

10. Flares

11. Kitty Litter or Sand

12. Booster Cables







# Ag Tax Management To Be Discussed

One month has passed since our wonderful medical profession has realigned my spine, cleaned out the corrosion in some of the major nerve channels and inserted some wood screws to hold my spine in place. Recovery is on pace and I am now able to spend a full day in the office and continue writing a weekly column.

The first thing I need to do is call attention to the tax program scheduled Friday, November 30th, 9 a.m. to 12 noon CST. This interactive video meeting will take place in the Conference Room of the Williams County Courthouse. The agenda of the meeting provides an excellent opportunity for agricultural producers and tax preparers to learn about tax management alternatives while there is still time to implement year-end tax management decisions.

There will be updates on issues regarding federal income taxes and estate taxes. The IRS will discuss issues such as audit emphasis and identity theft awareness for tax-payers and practitioners. Depreciation rules and strategies

will be reviewed. The proper use and opportunities for likekind exchanges will be detailed.

A discussion on different business entities for farmers and their tax implications will be provided and strategies for using S-Corp's for farming will be explored. Lastly, there are sessions which provide an overview of when to accelerate or defer income in conjunction with expense timing to manage tax liabilities now and for the future.

The program, sponsored by the NDSU Extension Service and Internal Revenue Service, will feature presentations by Ann Makres, IRS; Steve Eckroth, EideBailly, Bismarck; Brenda Laub, CPA, Valley City; Steve Troyer, EideBailly, Fargo; and Marshall McCullough, OhnstadTwichell, West Fargo.

Four question and answer periods are scheduled during the three-hour program. Pre-registration is required, as seating is limited. The cost for the program and materials is \$12.

**Cropping Decisions 2013** 

A series of "Cropping Decisions 2013" meetings have been scheduled for December 10-14 across northwest North Dakota. The NDSU Extension Service in Williams County will be hosting one of these meetings in the Conference Room of the Williams County Courthouse on Wednesday, December 12<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 p.m. The outlook for next year's cropping season may be coupled with many questions ranging from what crop prices are going to be to what the growing

season may bring in terms of moisture, temperature, etc. The "Cropping Decisions 2013" meeting series is designed to cover a variety of agronomic, management, and market issues that could be of concern to producers in the 2013 growing season.

One of the speakers will be Joel Ransom, NDSU Extension Cereal Crops Agronomist. He will discuss the disease called Fusarium Head Blight, (FHB), also referred to as scab. This disease was the primary reason for moving durum production to this area of the state from the north central and eastern regions. Given the right moisture conditions, it has occasionally become a problem in this region. Ransom will discuss why there are market discounts on wheat infected with FHB but more importantly he will share management strategies to reduce the impacts of FHB and disease forecasting models to aid in the decision to apply fungicides as a preventative measure.

Frayne Olson, NDSU Extension Crop Marketing Economist, will cover two related topics. The first is changes that are occurring in the Canadian grain marketing systems and the implications and possible impacts of those changes on U.S. markets. He also will provide a crop market outlook for what is left of 2012 and into the 2013 crop year.

Chris Augustin, Area Extension Soil Health Specialist, will talk about soil health, the impacts of salinity and salinity management.

Other similar meetings are scheduled December 12, 9 a.m., Dakota Theater in Crosby and December 13, 1:30 p.m., McKenzie County Courthouse.

# Mercy Medical Center Seeks Input From Area Residents About Community's Health Needs

In an effort to gauge the overall health needs of the community, Mercy Medical Center (MMC) will survey area residents during an approximate fourweek period. Results of the survev will provide guidance to MMC on better ways to address health care needs. The survey is part of a community health needs assessment initiated by MMC. MMC is receiving assistance in conducting the assessment from the Center for Rural Health at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences.

Mercy Medical Center strongly encourages all area residents to participate in the survey. Surveys will be distributed to area residents through various channels, including through members of a Community Group convened by MMC as part of the community health needs assessment process. Residents may access an inter-

active, online version of the survey at www.tinyurl.com/willistonsurvey or by visiting Mercy's website mercy "dash" Williston "dot" org. Additionally, written copies are available by calling Mercy Medical Center, Volunteer Services at 701.774.7483. All survey responses are anonymous, and there is no way to track responses back to individuals. Survey responses are returned to the Center for Rural Health to help ensure anonymity. A postage-paid return envelope is included with each written survev.

The survey will allow local providers to learn of the community's awareness of local health care services being provided, receive suggestions and help identify any gaps in services, learn about community health and other concerns, and determine preferences for using local health care versus traveling to other facilities. In addition to specific questions, the survey

also seeks general, open-ended input from residents about the community's health needs and the delivery of local health care. Completing the survey takes about 10 to 15 minutes.

"Feedback from our community is greatly needed and appreciated, in helping us to identify community health needs. Once our assessment is complete, we will review the results and identify a couple of primary concerns that fall within our scope of service and begin to work on providing viable solutions. We will also share our findings with other civic organizations if a specific need falls within their jurisdiction of care or ser-

vice", stated Matt Grimshaw, CEO at Mercy Medical Center.

A periodic community needs assessment is one of the new requirements of the Affordable Care Act. The new regulations require non-profit hospitals such as Mercy Medical Center to assess the community's health needs periodically. The

cost of the survey is covered by the Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility (Flex) Grant Program, a project of the Center for Rural Health. The Flex Program is a state-based partnership that works with and assists all rural hospitals to stabilize and sustain their local health care infrastruc-

intent to protest the application. The grounds for protest of an application for a transfer of location are limited to those set out in section 16-4-405, MCA, for a denial of a license, and public convenience and necessity as set out in section 16-4-203, MCA. If the protested application is for a transfer of ownership not involving a transfer of location, the grounds for protest are limited to those set out in section 16-4-405, MCA. Protest letters which do not provide the information described in this

paragraph will not be considered valid protest letters. Only those grounds for protest raised in valid protest letters will be considered at hearing. An individual's testimony will be limited to the grounds for protest raised in that individual's valid protest letter.

If the department receives a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(a), MCA, a hearing will be scheduled in Helena, Montana. If the department receives a sufficient number of

protests to require a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(b), MCA, to determine public conve-nience and necessity, a hearing will be held in the county in which the proposed premises is located. All qualified protestors will be notified of the time, date and location of the hearing. Hearings are typically scheduled within 90 days

following the protest deadline. If a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing are not received and all licensing criteria have been satisfied. the department may issue the license without holding a hearing.
