## Counterfeit Bills Appear in Sidney

On May 25, the Sidney Chamber of Commerce provided information that a local business received a $\$ 50$ counterfeit bill. They recently received information from a local bank that a $\$ 100$ US bill was turned in for deposit from the same local business that was confirmed to have a counterfeit bill. The counterfeit is a little smaller than a regular bill and has no security strip. The color is the same as an authentic bill, but it has no texture. If tested with a counterfeit pen, it shows black instead of the usual yellow. The chamber advises businesses to pay special attention to larger denomination bills to make sure that they are authentic currency. If you do come across a questionable bill, please retain the bill and notify law enforcement immediately. If the person or persons passing the bill refuse to stay until law enforcement arrives, please try to get a good physical description and description of any vehicles.

The E-rase your Ewaste committee has set aside the third Thursday of every month (May through August) to do a collection, according to organizers. The dates for the remaining summer month collections include J une $21^{\text {st, }}$, uly $19^{\text {th }}$ and August $16^{\text {th }}$.

# Weed Herbicide Resistance Talks Planned At Froid, Sidney ARS Field Days 

ricultural Research Service is helping host two dryland field days highlighting research being conducted at farmsites near Froid and Sidney on Thursday and Friday, J une 28th and 29th.This year's lineup for the two tours includes several shared speakers, demonstration studies and other festivities, so if you have to miss one event, you can still catch much of the information at the other.

Field Day Talks:
Headlining both events is North Dakota State University Professor J eff Stachler, who will discuss herbicide resistance in weeds. Although Dr. Stachler's primary research area is weed control in sugarbeets - and in particular management of problematic weeds in
Roundup Ready sugarbeet - his expertise carries over into other crops as well and includes research in confirmation, scouting and management of herbicide resistant weeds

Also at both events are speakers representing the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service
(NRCS) Plant Materials Cener in Bridger, MT. They will discuss the role of the Bridger Plant Materials Center in developing new plant solutions for the diverse ecosystems of Montana and Wyoming, including propagating threatened species and culturally significant plants, and reclaiming disturbed areas from mining, wildfire, and road construction. The Bridger facility is also working with Sidney and Miles City ARS researchers and others on a long-term study looking at the most effective Russian olive re-
moval methods and prospects for revegetation. ARS scientists will also be discussing that research effort at both the Froid and Sidney Field Days.

Also available at both events is the Montana Dept. of Agriculture's new Pesticide Container Recycling Truck. Technician Ron Ahlgren will be demonstrating the process at both Froid and Sidney, and producers are encouraged to bring in their CLEANED pesticide containers for recycling. Proper cleaning instructions are available at MDA's

## Fall Turkey Season Set, Apply Online <br> North Dakota's fall turkey season is set with 4,145 li- <br> licenses will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis

censes available to hunters, a decrease of 10 percent from last year.

Stan Kohn, upland game management supervisor for the state Game and Fish Department, said harvest and population data from hunting units in the southwest and in some units in the central part of the state indicate poor production and chick recruitment from 2008-2011.
"Even though last winter was beneficial to our turkey population, we don't know what turkey production will be like, and the number of breeding adult birds is lower than in past years," Kohn said. "If turkey production is exceptionally good this spring, an additional 1,300 licenses may be used early this fall in specific hunting units.

An experimental hunting season will continue for the USDA-AR S Northern Great Plains R esearch Lab in Mandan. A maximum of 30 licenses will be available. These licenses will be available at the Game and Fish Department once a person first obtains a permit from USDA-ARS

An experimental turkey bow hunting season will continue within the city of Bismarck to help control a growing population of birds in residential areas. A maximum of 25
to individuals who are licensed to bow hunt deer within the city. These licenses will be available at the Game and Fish Department in Bismarck once a person has a valid city archery permit.

Hunting units 21 (Hettinger and Adams counties) and 53 (Divide and Williams counties) will remain closed to fall turkey hunting in 2012 because of low turkey numbers.

The fall wild turkey season extends from Oct. 13 through Jan. 13, 2013.

Prospective hunters, including gratis applicants, can apply online, or print out an application to mail, at the state Game and Fish Department's website, gf.nd.gov. Paper applications will be available in mid-J une from Game and Fish Department offices, county auditors and license vendors.

Applications are also accepted at the department's tollfree licensing line, (800) 406-6409. A service fee is added for license applications made over the phone.

Applications for the fall season must be postmarked no later than J uly 5 . Only North Dakota residents are eligible to apply in the first lottery. Nonresidents can apply for fall turkey licenses that are still available following the first lottery.

## Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV)

 Program Grant Funding AvailableApply by Wednesday, August $1^{\text {st }}$
Montana State Parks (stateparks.mt.gov) is encouraging qualifying agencies, clubs and organizations to apply for the Off-Highway Vehicle Program (OHV) FY13 grant cycle funding. Applications must be received by Wednesday, August 1.

OHV grant applicants can include associations, organizations and clubs and federal, state, county or municipal agencies.

The OHV Grant Program eligible projects include; maintenance of existing OHV trails, signing, ethics education, noxious weed control adjacent to trails, enforcement, route mapping, and more.

To apply visit: http://fwp.mt.gov/recreation/grants/ohv/
Montana State Parks administers the OHV program with funds appropriated by the state legislature. The program relies on partnerships between private clubs and public land managing agencies. The OHV Advisory Committee, comprised of OHV users and land managers, advises Montana State Parks on the expenditure of grant funds and trail issues.

In FY12, 10 projects were funded with $\$ 151,000$ total in grant funding.

An OHV is a self-propelled vehicle used on public lands, trails, easements, lakes, rivers or streams and generally includes off-highway motorcycles, ATVs (quadricycles), air cushion vehicles, amphibious vehicles, and dune buggies 4X4 trucks licensed for road use and vessels registered as boats are not OHVs.

OHV Program funding comes from $1 / 8$ of $1 \%$ of the Distributor's Gasoline License Tax, registration decal fees, dealer registration, and nonresident permit fees.

Montana's OHV program has four components: the OHV Grant P rogram, enforcement of OHV laws, Safety Education, and Information/E thics Education Program.

Also, anyone buying a new or used watercraft can register online and generate a 10-day temporary permit that is valid until the registration is processed.

## 4-H Animal Projects Grow Adults

NDSU Extension Agent, Williams County
North Dakota county fair season is about to get its jump start. For some reason several counties in the northwest are usually the first to have their fairs. Williams County is one of those.

The fair in Williams County is actually known as the Upper Missouri Valley Fair (UMVF). I can only assume that its early founders speculated the UMV Fair could involve people beyond the boundaries of Williams County. To some extent, that has become a reality as several of the events involve youth from many other counties. Take for example the Western Star Heifer Classic and the North Dakota Junior Beef Expo. Both draw 4-H and FFA members from across North Dakota and eastern Montana. Then there is the Horse Show for which 4-H members in Richland, Roosevelt, Sheridan counties of Montana and Divide, Burke, Mountrail and McKenzie counties are invited to participate.

Despite different lifestyles, new communication technologies, and all the other changes which have occurred over the past 50-75 years, county fairs still excite youth, especially those with animals. Projects like cattle, horses, sheep, swine and even the smaller animals such as rabbits and poultry all require active adult involvement. With animal projects, parents and other adults play a vital support role.

This base of constant adult involvement reminds youth of their responsibility for the absolute necessity of daily feeding and the long term commitment which must be made when the project is selected

I think kids with animal projects have a greater opportunity to connect with real life. Animals are living organisms which are given birth and death. Frequently, 4-H and FFA members learn the fragility of life. Some are able to watch the birth of a new project and sometimes death of a bloated
steer. Over their 10 year membership in these youth organi zations, they will develop a pretty good understanding about the birds and the bees without a visit behind the barn with mom and dad.

During my career as a county extension agent I have seen many, many youth graduate from active involvement with $4-\mathrm{H}$ and FFA animal projects. Although there is no common path for their adult lives, most have a sense of persona pride about what they learned and accomplished through their experiences. And about all take the self-discipline learned with their animal projects into successful adult lives.

To see this for yourself I invite you to attend the Upper Missouri Valley Fair on Wednesday, June $20^{\text {th }}$ at 5 PM when the beef, sheep and swine members will put their projects on public display. All eligible blue and red ribbon animals will be offered for sale the following day, Thursday, J une $21^{\text {st }}$ at 5 PM.

Tree of the Week
This week I am going to make a daring decision by writing about Russian Olive. Some folks think this tree should be put on the State's noxious weed list because it is found growing on many sites where trees are not wanted. However Russian Olive has some features that make it worthy of consideration on some sites.

Let's start with its strong resistance to drought, toleration to a wide range in soil pH and adaptation to a wide variety of soils. Some people may argue that Russian Olive is more of a large shrub than a tree. This may be true in plantings left to grow wildly but it can be trained to look like a tree with some pruning.
or those of us who wish our trees would retain leaves onger into the fall, then Russian Olive warrants consideration. The silvery leaves remain attached very late into the fall. Most Russian Olive trees are found in field shelterbelts.

However, I can site several growing very well in landscapes. The silver leaf color makes for a nice color accent.

Russian Olive is an excellent tree for wildlife. The fruits can be used for food either fresh or processed as soup sea soning, jellies or sherberts. I have no experience with using the fruits as food but my forestry advisors say the fruits are best after a frost.

When grown in the wild or field shelterbelts, the thorns provide wildlife protection from predators.

Please understand I have not fallen from a bar stool, however, a few Russian Olives growing in landscapes will add some color diversity in a community. Yes, I do have one growing in our backyard.

Public Comments Being Accepted On Final Pipeline Safety Review Council Report

The Montana Oil Pipeline Safety Review Council is accepting public comments on its final report, which is scheduled to be presented to Governor Brian Schweitzer on J uly 18, 2012. The report is the culmination of the work of the Oil Pipeline S afety Review Council, created by the Governor in the wake of the ExxonMobil Silvertip oil spill in J uly 2011. The purpose of the Council was to review all avaiable information for a a pailline rivercrossing in Montana to assess the risk of ruptures and leaks. The Governor askes the Council to Governorasked the Council to evaluate the regulaor ramework for pipelines and to identify any regulatory gaps that might exist. The Council was dations to prevent future failures

The report describes a new, interactive Montana Pipeline Safety Map created through a cooperative agreement with the federal P ipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) and with the assistance of pipeline operators. The map contains numerous layers of information including aerial photos, topographic maps, property boundaries and ownership, as well as locations of environmell as locations of environmental interestlike monitoring stations and wells.

The reportalso contains six recommendations designed to reduce the chances of future pipeline breaks that could spill products into Montana's waterways. It is available on the Departmentof Environmental Quality (DEQ) website at
www.deq.mt.gov. Comments on the report will be accepted until Wednesday J une 27, 2012.
