The McKenzie County Fair is happening Wednesday, June 14-Saturday, June 17. The county fair will be the debut event for McKenzie County Ag Expo, with the ribbon cutting ceremony being held during the Bulls & Broncs event.

General admission to the fair is free and the carnival will run Thursday-Saturday. Be sure to check out the vendors and take in the exhibits; 4-H animal showing is happening Thursday-Saturday.

There is free admission to the Olaf Leiseth Jr. Memorial Draft Horse Event at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, June 14. Events include an obstacle course, pole bending, swamper race, and corn cultivating. Thursday, June 15, is Military Day and there will be a parade at 4:30 p.m. on Main St., and a free beef barbeque at 5:30 p.m. Bulls & Broncs will kick off their event at 7 p.m., and the ribbon cutting ceremony for the McKenzie County Ag Expo will take place that evening. Additionally, the first annual Calf Scramble is happening during Bulls & Broncs; 4-Hers who will be in the 7-12 grade in the 2023-2024 school year will have a chance at catching a calf during the scramble. Those who do will be awarded a scholarship for their next show beef, heifer or steer. There will be a limit of 20 scramblers and 10 calves; contact Karissa Frick to sign up at 701-770-5537.

The Demolition Derby is taking the spotlight on Friday, June 16 with their Back the Blue Night. There will be two classes which are limited weld and chain. Payouts for each are \$3,000 for first place, \$2,000 for second, \$1,000 for third, and \$250 for fourth place. There is an opportunity for an additional \$3,250 for either class that has 10 or more cars; the money will go towards mad dog and additional placing. Last, but certainly not least, is the NDRA Rodeo on Saturday, June 17 at 7 p.m., slack at 12 p.m. Saturday is also EMS Day. Admission prices for all events are \$20 for adults, \$10 for ages 7-12, and free admission for those 6 and under.

The Taphouse Bar & Grill, located behind the Lone Tree Motor Inn, 900 S. Central Ave., Sidney, will be having an open house. Saturday, June 17, from noon-closing or while supplies last.

On Feb. 1, Ron Sorenson, his wife Sherry, their son Brent, and his wife Heather, Sidney, joined together and bought the Taphouse Bar & Grill.

The family-owned business will be having a crawfish and shrimp boil with corn on the cob, boiled potatoes, and assorted salads. There will also be burgers and brats for those not up for shellfish. Along with the limited menu, the Taphouse will have all their regular drinks. The crawfish, shrimp, corn, and potatoes will all be cooked onsite, outside where patrons can see. Food tickets will be \$30 for adults and \$15 for kids 12 and under. There will be \$3 pints on sale of select Watkins Distribution Beverages, formally MNC, products.

On April 1 they were

open to serve food, but wanted to wait until the weather got warmer before having the open house. Heather said, "This used to be a place we liked to come to once a week. We'd kinda like to see it go back to the way it was when we came." Sherry said, "We'd like to see it go back to like it was when it was the Regal Eagle. A place families can come to."

The Taphouse owners and staff will be happy to see their regular patrons and maybe a few more. For more information visit the Taphouse Bar & Grill Facebook page or stop in at 900 1/2 S. Central Ave., behind the Lone Tree Inn. into custody by the Richland County Sheriff's Office and incarcerated in the Richland County Detention Center. # McKenzie County Fatal Crash

At approximately 6:40 a.m., June 7, on McKenzie CR 10 near 132<sup>nd</sup> Ave. NW, a 2016 Kia Optima, driven by Clay Youngbird, Sidney, MT, was traveling westbound and entered the eastbound lane. An eastbound 2019 Chevrolet Silverado, driven by Colton Wood, Williston, ND, swerved right to avoid the westbound Kia Optima. At the same time, the Kia Optima swerved left to get back in the westbound lane. The Chevrolet Silverado struck the Kia Optima head on. The Kia Optima entered the north ditch and rolled. Wood was wearing his seatbelt and sustained minor injuries. He was transported to a local medical facility. Youngbird was not wearing his seatbelt and was ejected from the vehicle. He was pronounced deceased on scene.

At the time of the crash the road conditions were good and dry and the weather conditions were good.

This crash remains under investigation by the North Dakota Highway Patrol.

On June 7, at approximately 7:20 a.m. CST, a 2006 Kenworth driven by David Jordann, Killdeer, ND, was eastbound on Highway 85 near mile marker 153. It went off the roadway, striking a traffic safety device. The Kenworth came to a stop in the south ditch. Jordann suffered a medical emergency and was found unconscious inside the vehicle. He was given medical assistance and transported to McKenzie County Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

# Fort Union Association Celebrates 30th Anniversary

Williston, ND - The Fort Union Association (FUA) is celebrating its 30th anniversary this year.

FUA was founded in April 1993, by Williston-native Marv Kaiser and Fort Union Trading Post National Historic Site Superintendent Paul Hedren thanks in part to a generous loan from the Friends of Fort Union & Fort Buford. Kaiser, Hedren and other founding board members sought a way to share the trading post's rich history and support the historical, cultural, scientific, and educational activities of Fort Union Trading Post National Historic Site and the National Park Service.

Today, Fort Union Association runs the bookstore, located within the Bourgeois House at Fort Union. The association helps enhance visitors' experiences through the sale of educational and interpretive materials such as accurate reproduction trade goods, commemorative merchandise, books, and other items. FUA also assists and supports Fort Union Trading Post with workshops, demonstrations, and events.

FUA invites the public to help celebrate its 30th year by attending the Annual Rendezvous, scheduled for June 15-18, Indian Arts Showcase, scheduled for Aug. 5-6, and Living History Weekend, scheduled for Sept. 2-3. Visitors can also pick up a commemorative t-shirt, with purchases over \$10, or for purchase alone at \$5 from the bookstore at Fort Union, while supplies last. Shirts will be available by mid-June.

Fort Union Trading Post National Historic Site, located near the confluence of the Missouri and Yellowstone Rivers, was established by John Jacob Astor's American Fur Company and Upper Missouri Outfit in 1828 as a trading post for exchanging furs with Assiniboine Indians, and over eight other Northern Plains tribes. Throughout its 39year existence, Fort Union Trading Post became one of the most important trading posts in the Upper Missouri River region, serving as the head of navigation for many years and a hub of trade. The fort was also a hub of cultural exchange between Northern Plains tribes and

Euro-Americans. The trading post closed in 1867. It was purchased by the Army and disassembled. Its remains were sent two miles east to begin construction of Fort Buford.

Fort Union Trading Post National Historic site is located 23 miles west of Williston, ND. No fees are required to visit the site. It is open 7-days a week, 9 a.m.-5 p.m. CT, with the exceptions of Christmas, Thanksgiving and New Year's Day. 

The Watford City FFA Livestock Show will be located in the main, inside arena at the new McKenzie County Ag Expo and will run from 8-11 a.m. The current schedule is swine starting at 8 a.m., goats at 8:45 a.m., sheep at 9:30 a.m., and beef at 10:15 a.m. Please be advised that this schedule is subject to change should the showings end up running early or late.

The Watford City FFA Livestock Show was started in 2022 by Watford City FFA Advisor Samantha Doneen and Alexander FFA Advisor Nettie Denowh because they recognized there was a lack of opportunities for FFA members to participate in the McKenzie County Fair with their livestock.

"This is a huge opportunity for members to get an extra opportunity to display their animals," commented Doneen.

Due to time constraints and scheduling conflicts with 4-H showings, there will not be a sale based on the Watford City FFA Livestock Show and FFA members will not be able to sell their livestock.

Registration for beef is full, however, there are still openings in goats, sheep and swine. Interested FFA members can register at <u>bit.ly/ffashow</u>. Members will need to show up with their animals prior to the event on Friday morning, be ready to show by 8 a.m., and be wearing a collared shirt.

Miller's daughters would later tell of how he would go to the arena every night and watch Bryar Lange, Jordan Skaley, their father Kylee Lange, Taylor and Randy Searer, and other community members work to restore it. Once restored,

he went to watch them rope, mentioning that it was the highlight of his last couple vears.



# Letter To The Editor

#### Protecting Montanans' Freedoms

This last election cycle many Republicans campaigned and were elected on the promise to enhance freedom in Montana. This session, Republicans accomplished that mission. House Republicans continued to protect religious freedom in school settings, and passed HB 744, which allows students to discuss faith in school without fear of punishment. After all, our government funded education system exists for our students and they should be able to express their free speech. Freedoms of veterans were strengthened by passing HB 583, which creates licensing reciprocity for military members and spouses. Military families are mobile and now their Montana career opportunities are too. House Republicans defended Montana gun owners by passing SB 359, which bans financial institutions from tracking gun purchases. Tracking your 2nd Amendment purchases will no longer happen in Montana. Also, HB 584 was passed which bans the state from entering contracts

with anti-gun businesses. The rights of property owners were enhanced by the passage of SB 159, which prohibits eminent domain for cultural or recreational purposes. Government at any level should never take your private property by force to install a running trail or bird sanctuary, eminent domain should be only an extreme measure taken for the most critical of infrastructure.

Education freedom took a monumental step forward this session. Montana families now have the option to utilize both open enrollment (HB 203) and partial enrollment (HB 396) and HB 393 provides Montana's nearly 20,000 special education students and their families greater access to the individualized educational services they need. With the passage of HB 562, which authorizes the establishment of community choice charter schools, and HB 549, which authorizes the establishment of public charter schools, communities can choose the best options for their students and communities. Each of these bills is intended to let parents craft their child's education to best fit their needs, and it was all accomplished while making one of the biggest investments in state history in public education.

One of the biggest accomplishments of the session was a record tax rebate and lowering the overall income tax rate for all tax paying Montanans. Republicans prioritized protecting Montanan's personal income. It's your money, you keep it. However, if you are one of small minority of Montanans that wanted state government to keep all the surplus, you can donate your rebate check at https://www.mt.gov/ business/donations.aspx. As for the rest of us, your Republican House will keep fighting to provide essential state government on less of your money. Monetarily and ideologically House Republicans voted to enhance your individual freedoms.

panions don't provide any personal care (bathing, administering medications, etc.) they do provide valuable assistance that allow clients to remain independent for as long as possible. Companions can prepare meals, accompany clients to medical appointments, help with shopping and errands, assist with household management and provide friendly fun and conversation.


Because of the personal nature of the relationship between companion and client, the program works hard to make sure they match people with similar interests and assess needs to ensure the companion is comfortable with the level of help needed by the client. Some companions may only be comfortable making weekly visits to other seniors while some companions may help a young adult with a disability organize their entire week. No matter what level of companionship you are comfortable with,

there is someone waiting to benefit from your help.

Senior Companions are not paid but they do receive an hourly stipend for their time and reimbursement for mileage and expenses incurred during their volunteer work. "It's definitely not about the money", says Palmer "but it is nice to not have any financial worries get in the way of volunteering."

Our area Senior Companion program is grant funded and run by the Area 1 Agency on Aging, Glendive, with workstations scattered throughout their service area. Bozeman - The Montana State University College of Agriculture and Montana Agricultural Experiment Station have announced the dates for their annual agricultural field days, which will take place at research centers around the state.


