What started as a community picnic after harvest season in Alexander, North Dakota, has, like so many early gatherings developed into large boisterous occasions that last for days and attract party goers and vendors alike. The annual Old Settler's Day celebration here is four days chocked full of activities that don't disappoint. During the 2012 Old Settler's Day Celebration, Alexander city management found itself having to manage the influx of visitors during a time when road construction was creating chaos. With that out of the way, this year movement to all activities should be much better.

This year the Old Settler's Day celebration will be held Labor Day weekend August 29th, 30th, & 31st. There will be a parade, honoree program in the park, an arts and crafts show, bands and dancing in the evening, a ranch rodeo, potluck dinner that includes beef BBQ (an integral part of any celebration in the summer or well, any occasion, really) and Sunday church service provided by local churches.

Sessions will be offered over the Interactive Video Network System (IVN) from 8:30 AM CT to 12:30 PM CT at the Courthouse in Watford City. Registration deadline to enroll in the course is Friday, Sept 13.

This program is offered by the North Dakota State University Extension Service and classroom training will be provided by professionals in their respective fields. Upon completion of the Master Gardener Program, participants will be well schooled in the basics of plant and soil science, perennial and annual flowers, plant pathology, entomology, and weed control, vegetable and fruit production and more.

Cost to participate in this program is \$150 with the contribution of 48 volunteer hours of sharing of the individual's expertise in the community or \$300 without the volunteer hour contributions.



# Agency Selects Projects Addressing Critical Housing Needs

The North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA) has committed more than \$20 million from the Housing Incentive Fund (HIF) to 18 projects across the state.

"The need for affordable housing is felt in communities statewide," said members of the North Dakota Industrial Commission in a joint statement at their recent meeting. "NDHFA selected projects that address one of the state's most critical needs – housing for police officers, teachers, nurses, waitresses, clerks and elderly and disabled households."

The 2013 Legislature re-authorized HIF at \$35.4 million with a priority of providing housing for essential service workers (ESW) in energy-impacted counties and preserving and providing for low and moderate income households.

NDHFA received 26 applications totaling more than \$36 million. Applicants that set aside units for ESW received a scoring preference. More than half the successful applicants reserved units specifically for ESW. The projects selected include:

Beach - \$350,000 to Luretto Bay 7 to construct Luretto Bay 7, 12 units, 6 units for ESW. Total project costs \$1.4 million; Bismarck - \$361,683 to Community Homes of Bismarck, Inc. for the North 19th 4-plex, 5 units. Total project cost is \$1.2 million: Bismarck - \$425,000 to Independence Point, LP to construct Independence Point, 24 units. Total project cost is \$3.8 million; Devils Lake - \$385,269 to Agassiz Properties LLLP to construct Agassiz Circle Phase II, 8 units. Total project cost is \$1.29 million; Dickinson - \$1.42 million to Sullivan Properties, Inc. for Sullivan Apartments, 30 units. Total project cost is \$4.79 million; Dickinson - \$200,000 to Heritage Hills I LLLP for Heritage Hills, 42 units. Total project cost is \$8.19 million; Dunn Center - \$700,000 to Lutheran Social Services Housing for Dunn Center Apartments, 18 units. 6 for ESW. Total project cost is \$2.32 million; Fargo - \$1.14 million to Beyond Shelter, Inc. for North Sky I, 24 units. Total project cost is \$2.86 million; Hettinger - \$932,400 to Lutheran Social Services Housing for Courtside Village, 24 units. 12 units for ESW. Total project cost is \$3.06 million; Lignite - \$1.27 million to Lignite Investments, LLC for Lignite Housing Project, 28 units. 9 units for ESW. Total project cost is \$4.56 million; Mandan - \$1 million to Dakota Commercial & Development to construct Collins Place, 29 units. Total project cost is \$3.89 million; Minot - \$2.25 million to SW Design Build to construct Rolling Ridge Estates, 48 units. 24 units for ESW. Total project cost is \$7.5 million; Turtle Lake - \$450,983 to Turtle Lake Housing Authority for Turtle Lake Community Housing, 8 units. Total project cost is \$1.5 million; Watford City - \$1.2 million to McKenzie Healthcare Systems to construct McKenzie Healthcare Systems Employee Housing, 24 units. 18 units for ESW. Total project cost is \$3.6 million; Watford City - \$1.48 million to Wolf Run Village, Inc. for Wolf Run Village, 42 units. 18 units for ESW. Total project cost is \$6.72 million; Watford City - \$725,000 to the Girard Family Trust for adaptive reuse of the McKenzie Ranger District Station Apartments, 9 units. All of the units for ESW. Total project cost is \$2.43 million; Williston - \$3 million to Dakota Commercial & Development to construct Williston State College Housing Phase II, 74 units. 43 units for ESW. Total project cost is \$10 million; Williston - \$3 million to Renaissance Station LLC for Renaissance on Main, 45 units. 23 units for ESW. Total project cost is \$10 million.

An ESW is defined as an individual employed by a city, county, school district, medical or long-term care facility, the state of North Dakota, or others determined by NDHFA to fulfill an essential public service. To qualify for these rent-restricted units, a household's primary source of income must come from employment in the ESW identified field.

HIF received a \$15.4 million general fund appropriation from the state. The balance of the fund must be capitalized by taxpayer contributions.

"Before any of these projects can break ground, the fund must have contributions adequate to cover the conditional commitments," said Jolene Klein, NDHFA acting executive director. "Contributing to HIF is a simple yet highly effective way to help North Dakota communities build safe, decent and affordable housing for all their residents."

Individuals and businesses contributing to HIF receive a dollar-for-dollar state tax credit. Contributions can be directed to a specific project or community. NDHFA is authorized to issue tax credit certificates to contributors on a first-come, first-served basis up to a maximum of \$20 million. Contributions to the fund currently stand at more than \$1.1 million.

### **Deer Archery Season Opens**

North Dakota's deer archery season opens Friday, Aug. 30 at noon, and bowhunters are reminded that deer bow licenses and accompanying tags are only available through electronic purchase this year.

Bowhunters can buy a license online at the State Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd.gov; by calling (800) 406-6409; or at license vendors in counties that are linked to the Game and Fish Department's online licensing system.

In counties that are not on the Game and Fish system, deer bow licenses will not be available at the usual license vendors. Hunters who purchase bow licenses online should allow for several days to receive their tag in the mail.

County auditors and all their authorized license vendors that are part of the Game and Fish Department electronic licensing system are: Adams, Barnes, Benson, Bottineau, Bowman, Burleigh, Cass, Dickey, Grand Forks, Grant, McIntosh, Mercer, Morton, Ramsey, Ransom, Rolette, Sargent, Stark, Steele, Stutsman, Walsh, Ward and Williams.

Bowhunters must follow all regulations of the managing agency when using tree stands on public hunting areas, including displaying the owner's name, address and telephone number on tree stands left unattended on Game and Fish wildlife management areas.

In addition, hunting big game over bait is prohibited on both public and private land in deer units 3E1, 3E2, 3F1, 3F2 and 3C west of the Missouri River.

The archery season is open through Jan. 5, 2014. Hunters should refer to the 2013 deer hunting guide for season information and regulations.

### Few MT Fall Turkey **Surplus Permits** Available

Some over-the-counter surplus licenses for deer B, elk B and fall turkey permits are still available in a few areas.

Surplus licenses are those still remaining after Montana's recent special hunting license or special permit drawing. The left-over licenses or permits are sold on a first-come firstserved basis. "B" licenses are for hunting antlerless deer or elk and fall turkey permits must be used with a valid turkey license.

Surplus fall turkey permits are available in a couple areas, 375-50, valid in Gallatin County and a portion of Madison County east of the Madison River and 385-50 which is valid for Park County.

The licenses or permit may be purchased online at fwp. mt.gov, then click "Buy a License"; or from any FWP license provider.

Hunters may possess a total of seven deer B licenses in any combination via drawing, over-the-counter, or surplus purchase. The list of available licenses can be viewed online at fwp.mt.gov.

Bonnie Zahn Griffith

is a plein air painter and landscape artist who works Millers' Corner

Convenience Store,

mostly in pastels, oils and monotype printing. The rich pigments of pastel and oil allow her to create paintings that have the brilliance and bold color seen in the landscapes of the western United States. Griffith constantly experiments with a variety of mediums such as encaustics, inks, paints and pastels. The best representation of the statement she wants to make is with the bold and brilliant pigments, whether pastels,

oils or printing monotypes, allowing her to bring depth and texture, light and mood into a painting or print. Her goal is "to create work that draws the viewer in to experience the time of the day, the temperature, the sound, the smells. I want the viewer to experience the work and get lost in it - even for a moment."

"My love of the landscape prompts me to paint it. I look for a story to tell when I look at the sagebrush

hills, the lush river lands. the wheat fields, the intense greens of spring in rich mountain vallevs and the ever changing colors of the desert. My me-

diums allow me to tell that story with great color and intensity and, if I have been able to create a piece that brings the viewer into it to experience it, then I have done my job."

Griffith grew up on a ranch near the Missouri Breaks in Central Montana, the child of artist parents.

"We lived in a remote area and there wasn't much for a kid to do in the evenings but read and draw. I did


both, getting into my mother's paints and paper; and create I did. My life was riding horses, drawing and painting, reading and all the stuff, including chores, a kid growing up on



a good sized ranch does. I

don't remember ever 'being bored' because there was always something that interested me in one of those areas." Griffith attended college in Chicago in the early 70s, staying there to work after graduation. Missing the west, she moved back to Montana in 1975 and worked until employment moved her to southwestern Washington. After over twenty years there, Griffith now lives in Miles City, MT where she is the executive director of the WaterWorks Art Museum and spends her free time painting. She is a member and President of the Northwest Pastel Society, member of the Landscape Artists International (juried membership), Pastel Society of the West Coast and the Blue Buffalo Artists group. Griffith has served as a curator for an art center in Washington and as a juror of art exhibitions in the northwest. She also teaches workshops in pastel painting.





### **Hunters Reminded of Big Game Transport Rules**

Big game hunters are reminded of requirements for transporting deer, elk and moose carcasses and carcass parts into and within North Dakota as a precaution against the possible spread of chronic wasting disease.

Hunters harvesting a big game animal this fall in North Dakota deer unit 3F2 cannot transport a carcass containing the head and spinal column outside of the unit unless it's taken directly to a meat processor. The head can be removed from the carcass and transported outside of the unit if it is to be submitted to a State Game and Fish Department district office, CWD surveillance drop-off location or a licensed taxidermist.

If the deer is processed in the field to boned meat, and the hunter wants to leave the head in the field, the head must be legally tagged and the hunter must be able to return to or give the exact location of the head if requested for verification.

In addition, hunting big game over bait is prohibited in deer units 3E1, 3E2, 3F1, 3F2 and 3C west of the Missouri River.

Hunters are prohibited from transporting into North Dakota the whole carcass, or certain carcass parts, of deer, elk, moose or other members of the cervid family from areas within states and provinces with documented occurrences of CWD in wild populations, or from farmed cervid operations within states and provinces that have had farmed cervids diagnosed with CWD. Only the following portions of the carcass can be transported:

Meat that is cut and wrapped either commercially or privately.

Quarters or other portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached.

Meat that has been boned out.

Hides with no heads attached.

Clean (no meat or tissue attached) skull plates with antlers attached.

Antlers with no meat or tissue attached.

Upper canine teeth, also known as buglers, whistlers or

Finished taxidermy heads.

Hunters should refer to the 2013-14 CWD proclamation on the Game and Fish Department's website, gf.nd.gov, for game management units, equivalent wildlife management units, or counties in other states that have had free-ranging deer, moose or elk diagnosed with CWD. Importation of harvested elk, white-tailed deer, mule deer, moose or other cervids from listed areas are restricted.

### **PLOTS** Guide **Available** Online

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department's Private Land Open To Sportsmen Guide for 2013 is now available online at the Department's website, gf.nd.gov. In addition, PLOTS Guides will be available at most license vendors throughout the state in early September.

The guide will feature about 760,000 PLOTS acres. Because the guide is printed in mid-August, some PLOTS tracts highlighted in the guide may have been removed from the program since the time of printing. There will also be some PLOTS tracts where the habitat and condition of the tract will have changed significantly. Conversely, Game and Fish may have added new tracts to the program after the guide went

To minimize possible confusion, Game and Fish will update PLOTS map sheets weekly on its website.

The PLOTS Guide features maps highlighting these walkin areas, identified in the field by inverted triangular yellow signs, as well as other public lands. In addition, a one-page advertisement announces a photo contest for the cover of the 2014 PLOTS Guide. From end-of-day hunting shots, to scenic action or landscape shots, the Game and Fish Department wants to feature hunter photos on the cover and elsewhere in the guide that showcase North Dakota's strong hunting

PLOTS Guides are free, and available at county auditor offices and license vendors in the state; by walk-in at the Game and Fish Department's Bismarck office; and at district offices in Riverdale, Harvey (Lonetree), Williston, Dickinson, Jamestown and Devils Lake.

The guides are not available to mail, so hunters will have to pick one up at a local vendor, or print individual maps from the website.

### **Duck Brood Index Down from Last Year**

North Dakota's 2013 fall duck flight is expected to be down significantly from last year, but still similar to the good fall flights of 2007-11.

Mike Johnson, game management section leader for the State Game and Fish Department, said the fall flight estimate is a combination of the spring breeding duck survey and the summer brood survey.

Results from the breeding duck survey in May indicated the duck index was down 17 percent from 2012, but still exceeded the long-term average by 73 percent.

12 percent above the long-term average.

The mid-July waterfowl production survey indicated a duck brood index that was down 48 percent from 2012, but still 27 percent above the long-term average. Average brood size was 7.2 ducklings, up 0.3 from last year. The long-term average is 7.1 ducklings per brood.

The water index in mid-July was up 60 percent from last year and 67 percent above the long-term average.

The index does not count every water body or duckling in the state. Instead, biologists sample representative transe across the state each year. Over time, survey results provide May water conditions were up 17 percent from 2012 and biologists with trend information that allows annual comparisons of waterfowl production in the state.





### **Living History Weekend at** Fort Union Begins Aug. 31

Living History weekend August 31 through September tells the story of the Northwest Company's purchase of Fort Union from the American Fur Company.

The setting for this year's Last Bell Tour is based on events that occurred from June 17 through September 17. 1865 through the eyes of the employees from Chouteau and Company. A series of changes were experienced during this time and the fort re-enactors, staff and volunteers will bring this story to life. This will set the stage to give the visitors that view from the past.

Saturday's Last Bell Tours begin in the upper

parking lot, where visitors assemble. Tour leaders will orient visitors and escort them through the fort where they will be confronted by a series of period scenes. Beginning at 8 p.m., six tours of 20-25 people each will be conducted through the trading post at 15-minute intervals. Tours will begin at 8 p.m., 8:20 p.m., 8:45 p.m., 9 p.m. and 9:20 p.m. The fort will be illuminated by candlelight, lanterns and fireplaces.

The Last Bell Tours are only a part of Living History Weekend; August 31 to September 2, when the area muzzleloaders, staff and other re-enactors become engages (laborers), clerks and traders, Indian Warriors, and Metis women. Besides living in the fort, re-enactors eat meals cooked out behind the Bourgeois House on a wood-burning stove.

Fort Union's Trade House will be open every day throughout September, staffed by living history interpreters. Stop in at

the visitor's center to get the latest updates on our changes or any upcoming events, or visit our website at www.nps.gov/ fous or on Facebook.

Fort Union is open from 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. CDT daily at Fort Union until Labor Day, and 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. in the winter. Fort Union Trading Post is located 24 miles north of Sidney, Montana and 25 miles southwest of Williston, North Dakota, via Highway 1804. While here, visitors are encouraged to tour the reconstructed fort, trade room and bourgeois house. Fort Union is free of

charge to visit.



# R & T Water Supply Commerce Authority Celebrates Additional Water Supply from WAWSA Submitted by Heather Syverson

The residents and businesses served by the R & T Water Supply Commerce Authority now have greater access to high-quality drinking water, thanks to additional supply from the Western Area Water Supply Authority (WAWSA). The R & T system was officially hooked up to WAWSA service today (8/13). "WAWSA wants to thank the State Legislators, Governor Dalrymple and the State Water Commission who continue to recognize the value and benefit of the Western Area Water Supply Project (WAWSP). With their support, we will remain on track to provide high-quality drinking water to northwestern North Dakota communities that need service as soon as possible," says Denton Zubke, WAWSA Chairman.

Representative Bob Skarphol of Tioga, loyal supporter of the project for the last two legislative sessions, provided the keynote comments at today's celebration at the R & T Water Treatment Plant to celebrate the new WAWSP connection. Rorv Nelson, the State's new Western North Dakota Energy Impact Coordinator, was also on hand on behalf of Gov. Jack Dalrymple. "What comes to the top of the list for all these areas that are getting strained by the growth are water, sewer, housing and roads. We can't do anything in the area without water. We can't have developments in cities and rural areas without water. We need a good supply of water and I think that this is a great system," says Nelson. Representative David Rust of Tioga and the Mayors of Stanley and Tioga, Mike Hynek and Nathan Germundson, attended the event. All of the project's stakeholders teamed up with Chairman Zubke and WAWSA Executive Director Jaret Wirtz to lead the group gathered in turning a water valve outside of the Water Treatment Plant to mark the new WAWSA service.

The WAWSP is being paid for largely through State loans through the Bank of North Dakota. Before he helped turn the valve, the CEO of the Bank of North Dakota, Eric Hardmeyer, said, "the Bank of North Dakota has \$90 million into this (WAWSA) project and I can't think of a better way to develop our assets than to provide water for industrial and commercial use, as well as residential." The oil industry purchases WAWSA's extra water capacity that's not currently being used by residential areas to repay loans from the state. Continental Resources has cost-shared a portion of the WAWSA infrastructure near Epping, ND. Dave Ruffie represented Continental Resources at today's event. He says the symbiotic relationship between WAWSA and the oil industry is a great opportunity for the industry to give back to local communities. "Continental is very pleased to be part of bringing rural water into the Williston Basin. We see this as a great opportunity to show our commitment to community and develop that relationship of industry and community together," says Ruffie. Joy Bickler, Hess Corporation Team Lead Contract Management, and Nelson, who also worked at Hess Corp. before accepting the Energy Impact Coordinator position with the state, echoed Ruffie's comments. "The daily work we do, we need water for fracking and other things. By purchasing something we need every day, it's going to help local cities and counties, and they're going to have a great water supply at the end," says Nelson.

Ray, Tioga and Stanley access their water through the R & T System. Wildrose and Crosby are also connected via extended pipelines. Last summer the area dealt with intermittent water restrictions and a moratorium on service to new housing developments due to water shortages. WAWSA provides an additional source of water to the communities served by the R & T System.

"We're so pleased that WAWSA water is now available to the R & T service area. Williston and Watford City residents already enjoy service from WAWSA and several more cities are set to be hooked up this year," says Wirtz. Later this summer, WAWSA will begin service to Fortuna, Noonan, Columbus and 200 to 250 rural users in western McKenzie County. The Western Area Water Supply Project will serve an estimated 100,000 people by the year 2035 in all or parts of Burke, Divide, McKenzie, Mountrail and Williams Counties. ## Back to School: School Nurses Lead Way to Healthy Year

(BPT) - While parents and students prep for back-to-school season, so too do the country's 74,000 school nurses, who are charged with helping maintain a healthy, thriving student body for the 2013-14 school year.

The nationwide average ratio of school nurse to students is one to 1,150, which is higher than the one-to-750 ratio recommended by the National Association of School Nurses (NASN) and Healthy People. While there is a shortage of funded school nurse positions, many states are moving to improve their ratios; 38 states increased their school nurse-to-student ratio between 1999 and 2009.

"The health care industry is shifting toward a community-based approach to health," says Dr. Bonnie Saucier, president of Chamberlain College of Nursing's Tinley Park, Ill. campus. "Community health centers, clinics and schools all play an important role in keeping the population healthy. As the health care industry focuses on prevention, the school nurse plays an even more vital role in

delivering health and wellness programs to students and their families."

School nurses serve to remove barriers to learning by providing early intervention services - like scoliosis and eyesight checks - to the entire student body. They also manage individual student cases, which include moderating allergy triggers or allocating prescribed medication. It is estimated that 20 to 30 percent of children have chronic health conditions. In many cases, the school nurse is the only health care professional students see on a regular basis; 9 percent of children do not have health insurance, which makes the role of the school nurse even more crucial.

Schools that employ a nurse report increased attendance as chronic illness is identified and managed; teaching staff can focus on teaching, rather than providing health care; and less strain falls on other health services because of reduced number of emergency calls, according to NASN.

"In order for a student to be successful in the classroom, he or she has to be physically and emotionally well," says Jennifer Joseph, a school nurse in Oak Park, Ill., and graduate of Chamberlain College of Nursing's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree program. "As a parent and school nurse, knowing my kids have access to a baccalaureate-prepared nurse in their schools makes me feel more at ease when I send them to school each day."

BSN degree programs, like Chamberlain's, enable students to earn their degrees in as few as three years of year-round study. Chamberlain's program introduces students to a variety of work settings - including schools - through diverse clinical experiences, and allows students to enter the workforce faster than peers in traditional four-year programs.

"Nurses who choose to serve in schools have the unique responsibility to care for students in the absence of their families," says Dr. Saucier. "The academic success and vitality of the community starts at the school, and the school nurse is at the center of it all."

### Hydroponics Gardening Increasing In **Popularity** if he were watering the

Hydroponics is a combination of two Greek words, "hydro" meaning and "ponics" meaning labor. It is a method of growing plants using a mineral solution in water, without using soil. Research has proven soil is not required for plants to thrive. When a plant root is placed in a mineral nutrient solution or in an inert medium, such as gravel, mineral wool, expanded clay, coconut husk or pebbles, it will grow at a rate of 30-50 percent faster than plant roots planted in soil and will produce a higher yield.

Last winter, 23 year Nathan Roth of Sidney, Montana heard about hydroponic gardens and began researching

it on the internet. He collected a 300 gallon water reservoir, ten - 55 gallon drums (which he cut lengthwise), a pump, some gravel and PVC pipe. He then designed his own pumping system to move water through the rocks to irrigate his plants. The water, along with a nutrient base of Urea and Liquid Sea Kelp Extract is giving Roth better results than any garden his family has ever grown in soil.

When asked what the pros of having a hvdroponic garden were Roth replied, "Low maintenance, easy to plant, no weeds and it uses less water." Roth estimates he uses approximately 50 gallons of water per week, which is far less than he'd use

same size soil garden a couple of times per week.

**Benefits** Hydroponic gardens:

Hydroponic plants have fewer diseases and fewer problems with bug infestations.

The hydroponic growing mediums help to stimulate root growth by mixing the nutrients with the water and delivering them directly to the root system, this saves the plant from having to search in the soil for the nutrients it requires and allows it to use its saved energy to grow faster and produce higher yields.

Topsoil is not used; therefore topsoil erosion is not an issue.

Less water is used.

Roth states "It's a social experiment and the first year is trial and error, but so far it's going really
