MonDak Area Suicide Awareness Walks/Runs To Be Held Throughout Sept.

The month of September is National Suicide Prevention Month, so in order to shed light on this national health problem, the MonDak region will be putting on several different suicide awareness walks/runs throughout the month.

The first event in this area will take place on Saturday, Sept. 12, in Watford City. The Suicide Awareness Run/Walk will start at 9 a.m. CDT in the parking lot of Stonehome Brewing Co. There will be routes mapped out for the 5K, 10K, and half-marathon races.

There is a \$30 fee for each race; all proceeds from this race will go to the National Alliance of Mental Illness, which is one of the nation's largest mental health organizations dedicated to building better lives for Americans affected by mental illnesses. The Eastern Montana Out of the Darkness Experience event will occur on Saturday, Sept. 19, at Veterans Memorial

Park, Sidney. Walker check-in will start at 9 a.m. MDT, and the opening ceremony will start at 10:15 a.m. Participants can join and create teams; registration is free, and all donations will go to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention - for more information on this specific event, you can visit www.afsp.org/easternmt.

"The event will look very different this year, but we are still going forward with having this important event for the community," stated Nick Kallem, Eastern Montana Out of the Darkness Experience event organizer.

The third suicide awareness event will take place on Saturday, Sept. 26, in Williston. The Williston Out of the Darkness Williston Experience will begin at 10 a.m. and go until 12 p.m. CDT. Registration for this event is free and can be completed online by searching "Williston Out of the Darkness Experience registration" and clicking on the AFSP website.

There will be four separate locations in Williston for participants to meet including the Alien Park, Harmon Park, Spring Lake Park, and Dakota Parkway. "We picked four

different locations to ensure that our walkers stay safe and healthy while spreading awareness. We are asking participants to pick one of those locations to walk around from 10 a.m.- noon. There will be t-shirts, honor beads, and water provided to participants at each of those locations," explained Tarren Rehak, event chair.

"I think more than ever, especially this year because of COVID-19, we need to come together as a community and let each other know that you're not alone, and there is hope, and we'll get through these tough times together,"

Although these events might look different compared to previous years, the mission to "Save Lives and Bring Hope to Those Affected by Suicide" has not changed. People who participate in this events join an effort to raise awareness and funds that allow suicide prevention groups to invest in new research, create educational programs, advocate for public policy, and support suicide loss survivors.

Prior to the main event, Reynolds Market, Sidney, is sponsoring a Light the Night for Cancer Care fundraiser lunch 11a.m.- 2 p.m., Friday, Sept. 11. Reynolds will be grilling the famous Redneck Main Link Brats. To-go lunches will include a Redneck brat, chips and water for \$5 per plate.

Richland County COVID-19 Update, Sept. 4, Active 6 Recovered 55 Deaths 2 Total 63

The Richland County Health Department is announcing additional active cases of COVID-19 in Richland County residents, and the release of another case from isolation. This brings the total case count to 63. At this time, 55 of the total cases are recovered, and six are active, with two deaths.

Active case updates are as follows:

Case 63: A male in his 70s who is not hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing. The individual was symptomatic. Case 62: A male between the ages of 0 and 9 who is not

hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing. The individual was named as a close contact to a positive case and became symptomatic in guarantine. Case 61: A female in her 20s who is not hospitalized

and is isolating at home. The case investigation is complete. The individual was named as a contact to a positive case and became symptomatic in quarantine.

Case 60: A female in her 20s who is not hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing. The individual was symptomatic.

Case 59: A male in his 20s who is not hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing. The individual was symptomatic.

The Health Department continues to monitor up to 30 close contacts daily. The Health Department's investigations show that residents could be doing more to follow COVID-19 preventative recommendations, particularly in regard to not going out when sick, staying home after being tested, and avoiding large gatherings. It is imperative that Rich-

Drive-Thru Flu Clinic Scheduled Sept. 24

The Richland Co. Health Department's annual Mass Flu Shot Clinic is switching to a drive-through format, scheduled for Thursday, Sept. 24, from 10 a.m.- 4 p.m. at Richland Co. Fire Hall, Sidney.

The Drive-Thru Clinic will serve adults only, and offers both regular and high-dose flu shots. No other shots will be given during the clinic. No appointment is needed. Flu shots cannot be given to those who have animals in their vehicles. Children may be in the vehicle, but may not receive flu shots. Follow traffic signs to enter the fire hall from the north side.

The Health Department carries quadrivalent, pre-filled syringes that contain no preservative. No FluMist is available. The price of flu vaccine will vary from \$40 - \$75, depending on the individual's age and the type of vaccine used. Medicaid, Medicare and private insurance may be billed for those who bring their cards. For self-pay clients, only cash or check can be accepted.

Flu clinic paperwork may be printed from www.richland. org/rchd, on the Richland Co. Health Department Facebook page, or obtained the day of the drive-through clinic.

DO NOT attend the clinic if you are not feeling well. DO NOT attend if you are waiting for test results from a COVID-19 test. DO NOT attend if you have COVID-19 or have been exposed to COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

Flu shots, as well as other vaccines, for children and families will be available during regular clinic hours, on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, 10 a.m.-4:30 p.m. by appointment. Additional clinic hours are the second Wednesday until 6 p.m., and the third Thursday of the month, from 1-4 p.m. by appointment. perience of doing a variety of artwork, but she claims that murals are one of her favorite types of art. "I really enjoy doing public art like this - this might be my favorite type of art that I do just because I know it will reach so many different people."

Roesch has done several murals in South Dakota, and more recently, she has done a mural in Jamestown. ND. "This summer, a mural project really just fell in my lap. A business in Jamestown got a grant for a mural, and the style they wanted was really close to what I do already, and it was only a block from where I live, so it really couldn't have been more perfect."

Jesse Veeder Scofield, Watford City, saw the mural she did in Jamestown and contacted Roesch to see if she could do one in Watford City. "I designed Jesse's most recent album cover earlier this year - it was such a huge opportunity. And then she had seen the mural I did in Jamestown, and asked if I would come do one in Watford City and here

Roesch is originally from Roscoe, SD, but currently resides in Jamestown, where she has been pursuing her career as an artist. She said, "'The last six years I've been doing art full time self-employed. I sell art at festivals in the summer and teach artist residencies at elementary schools. I have also started teaching one college credit at the University of Jamestown."

When asked how she became involved in art, she responded," art is just something that I have been doing since a young age, I just kept doing art until I became an artist. When I was young, my most inspirational person was my grandpa - he's a farmer and rancher in South Dakota, and he is quite good at drawing; he doesn't do anything professionally, but as a kid, I thought he was the best artist in the world, and I wanted to be an artist just like him, so I kept practicing. He's 93 years old, and he is still a big supporter and influencer in my life."

Representative Joel Krautter Honored for His Community Mental Health Work







E-Waste Collection Is This Friday & Saturday, Sidney, **Fairview**

The 16th annual "Erase your Ewaste" event gets under way in Sidney this coming Friday from 3-7 p.m. at the Richland County Public Shop next to the Fairgrounds. MonDak area residents...not just Richland County...are encouraged to bring their obsolete or damaged electronic items for recycling in both Sidney and Fairview this weekend. "Let us help you with your fall cleaning," Coordinator Heather Luinstra said.

Organizers and volunteers will be following county public health guidelines for COVID-19, including wearing masks and social distancing. Members of the public are asked to do the same if they have to get out of their vehicles for any reason. "By adhering to these guidelines we can continue to provide this service to our region," Luinstra said.

Sidney's event begins Friday and then continues from 9 a.m. to noon on Saturday. Fairview's event will be Saturday only, also from 9 a.m. to noon, at the water station on 9th Street. Fairview seniors or others needing assistance in delivering their e-waste may call Ray Trumpower at 742-5616.

Yellowstone E-waste Solutions, Billings is the e-cycler for the event and continues to offer their services for FREE. The only exception is a \$7 charge for removing a hard drive for those needing certificates of destruction or just wanting to hang on to them.

Large loads: As in past years, local businesses, agencies and organizations with large amounts to e-cycle are asked to make an appointment by calling Luinstra at 406-433-2207 or emailing hluinstra@richland.org.

No CRT televisions or monitors are being accepted and no projection TV units or consoles. Other limitations include no consumer white goods, vacuums, light bulbs, CFLs, mercury thermometers, alkaline batteries (rechargeable are okay), or items containing refrigerants (including dehumidifiers), oils, or acids.

The "E-rase your E-waste" effort is now in its 16th year and recycled 511,000 lbs., or 255 tons, of e-waste since 2005. The event is coordinated by members of the Richland County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC), Richland County Disaster and Emergency Services, and the USDA Agricultural Research Lab in Sidney. The Richland County Public Works Department also makes their facilities freely available for the collection event.
