Bakken NGL Pipeline Progressing

Oneok Partners representatives Steve Johnson, government regulations, and Brad Borrer, corporate communications, met last week with area press and Sidney Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Wade Van Every to discuss progress of the future Bakken NGL (Natural Gas Liquid) Pipeline.

"We are very encouraged by the progress being made," said Johnson. "Contacting and negotiating with landowners is moving forward and the regulatory agencies involved have been very accommodating."

Settlement with about 40% of the landowners in Montana has been made and plans to begin construction of the pipeline is set to begin May or June 2012, continuing until weather allows. "We want to do it right," said Borrer, "so construction in the winter is not an option." The pipeline is anticipated to be in service by 2013.

In July, Oneok Partners, a Tulsa, OK, based company, announced plans to build the multi-million dollar natural gas liquids pipeline through the region. The 500-mile Bakken Pipeline, starting near Sidney and traveling south through Wyoming into northern Colorado, will transport raw, unfractionated natural gas liquids from natural gas processing plants in the Bakken Shale area to the company's 50%-owned existing Overland Pass Pipeline which travels to Kansas where natural gas liquids are processed.

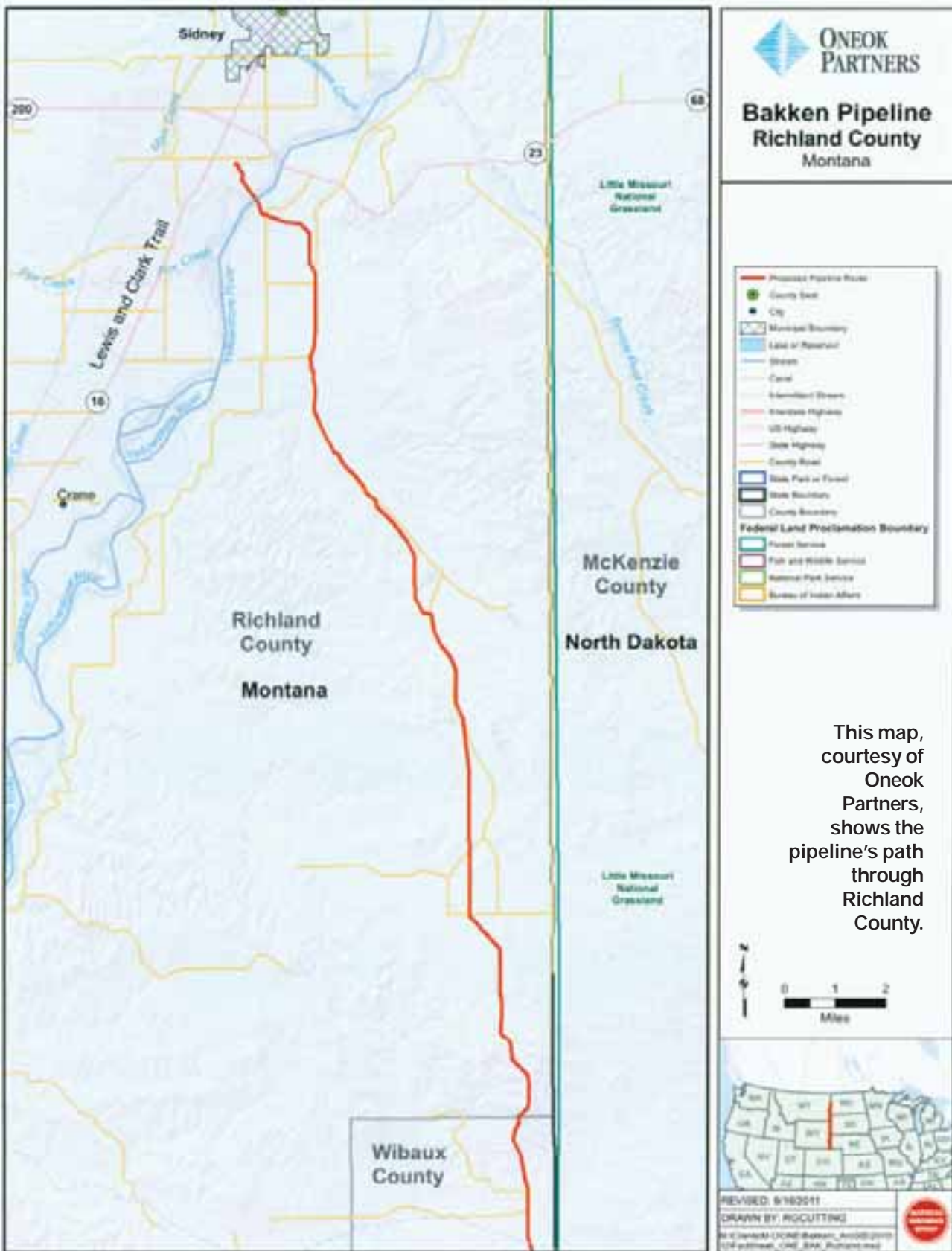
"This will be a safe and economical pipeline," said Johnson. "It will economically benefit the area with property tax dollars along with other businesses the construction will use." About 180 miles of the pipeline will run south through eastern Montana. Oneok will hire contractors to construct the pipeline in approximately four spreads.

"The rapidly increasing crude oil drilling activity in the region necessitates additional capacity to gather and process the growing natural gas volumes," said Terry K. Spencer, Oneok Partners chief operating officer, in a Oneok Partners press release in January.

Construction is now being done to complete three other natural gas processing facilities and gathering pipelines in Western North Dakota. Along with Oneok Rockies Midstream Plant, previously known as Bear Paw Energy Plant, they will quadruple the current processing capacity in the Williston Basin area. Oneok Partners will be investing \$1.5-1.8 billion in these growth projects.

The Bakken NGL pipeline is expected to deliver 60,000 barrels per day. Currently, Oneok has sold 80% of the gas that will be transported by the pipeline. The gas that is currently being burned off will be able to be contained and transported more efficiently.

The unfractionated NGLs produced from the Bakken Shale is transported by truck or rail at this time. With both NGL and crude pipelines, Bakken NGL and Keystone XL, being built, there will be less trucks hauling crude and NGLs to the market. A great benefit to the area.

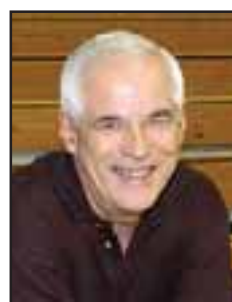

Dog Training Means Repetition, Consistency, Time

Upland bird season has arrived, and hunters tend to separate into two loose groups: those who hunt with dogs and those who hunt without the assistance of a four-legged friend. Those who prefer to have trained dogs along to help with the hunt generally use either pointing or retrieving dogs in their quest for game birds.

Bob Crandall, Yellowstone Kennels owner/operator, Sidney, trains both pointing and retrieving dogs but he specializes in the retrievers, as he believes retrieving dogs best fit the bill when hunting the most popular upland game bird – pheasant.

"The vast majority of upland hunting is for pheasant," Crandall remarks. "It is the most popular game bird and the most heavily hunted. Pheasants don't sit tight like Bobwhite quail. They seem to have roadrunner genes and prefer to hightail it out and keep going, and they generally go to the nastiest terrain they can find."

He continues, "Labs are the most popular and most used bird dogs in the country today. Retrievers will go into nasty terrain and flush birds, the hunter then shoots the bird, and the dog retrieves it. Because of this, Labs and pheasants are a natural match, so I spend my efforts on the largest area of interest; that of pheasant hunting with a retrieving dog."

Crandall summarizes good dog training into five words: repetition and consistency over time. Without consistent repetition of a task over a period of time, dogs will not perform as people expect them to. "The biggest mistake people make is that they try to go too fast," Crandall says. "A pup born in April cannot be a finished dog by October. Dogs have to have time to mature, and education has to come over time, just like with a child."

He continues, "You have to understand that you can never expect anything from a dog if you haven't given it enough repetition, and a dog is only as good as you expect it to be. To accomplish training, you must repeat and repeat the lessons, and you must have high standards to adhere to, which means consistency."

The repetitions and consistency in standards begin at weaning and continue on through the dog's early years, with additional learning added after the dog masters the basics. "Dog training is choosing the right tasks to repeat and repeat until it becomes a conditioned response," Crandall comments.

"Obedience is a conditioned response obtained through a tremendous number of repetitions."

Crandall believes all dogs need a basic foundation before they can learn additional tasks and become a finished dog. "I call the basic foundation 'yard work' where the dog learns basic commands so when you go to the field, you have some control," he says. "Basic yard work teaches a dog to come when called, sit when ordered, to heel on both sides, and the 'NO' command. I don't teach 'stay'. Rather, I teach an extended sit, which means the dog is taught to sit until it is told to do something else. The extended sit preps the dog to anticipate another command. This anticipation for the next command is what allows the trainer to teach dogs to respond to whistles and hand signals."

Ideally, a pup begins its education and training at weaning, learning its name, the word 'no', coming when called, and to learn and feel comfortable in its environment. "Dogs need a good environment to learn social skills," Crandall says. "Teach them the basics like their name and take them on walks around other people, expose them to noise, distractions, and change. Serious yard work then builds on what the dog already knows."

It takes a few years to produce a finished dog. Crandall teaches the basics the first year of a dog's life, including exposure to gunfire. He takes the dogs to the field and allows them to chase birds, have fun, and stoke their enthusiasm and interest in birds. The second year he refines the basics the dogs already have learned, refinements that turn them into finished, well trained retrieving dogs. "I build on the basics," Crandall remarks. "Dogs learn skills such as how to mark falls, run blinds, and run through obstacles and water."

Crandall trained dogs for years as a hobby before he turned to training dogs professionally. He credits both humans and dogs with teaching him the ropes. "I was introduced to dog training in 1970 when I worked for a kennel while attending college," Crandall remarks. "I knew five professional trainers who taught me a lot, and I've met a lot of very good dogs that taught me even more. The best teachers are the dogs, because each dog is unique and each dog teaches you something."

He adds, "I trained dogs for years as a hobby, but when it came time for me to retire, I turned an avocation into a vocation and began training dogs professionally. I enjoy this

very much. I take fewer dogs each year due to my age, but I really enjoy what I do."

As a young man, Crandall learned from other pros. He has returned this favor in his later years by helping in the training of an up-and-coming young area man, Tim Averett, who shows extraordinary promise as a trainer of retrieving dogs. "Tim is the best young trainer in the area," Crandall remarks. "Tim has trained with me and with Bill Nankivel as well as with several pros. He's as good a young retriever trainer as there is anywhere around. I'm proud of him."

Crandall also runs the Yellowstone Kennels, located just south of Sidney on County Road 122. He enjoys the kennels, and says that eventually the kennels will become the major portion of his business endeavors. "As I slow down in training, boarding is expanding," he concludes. "I like having dogs around, and I like to watch them. I have my training dogs but I also run a kennels but I do ask people to make reservations for boarding in advance."

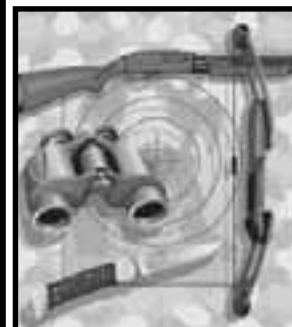

Plan A Hunt For Up & Coming Hunters

It is easy for veteran hunters, dads and granddads to plan traditional hunts to favored spots. But sometimes, in the excitement, the needs of young hunters in the family may be overlooked.

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks officials encourage experienced hunters—family or friends of family—to take the time to mentor young hunters.

FWP helps make it easy by offering special seasons and other license opportunities. Here are a few of these special opportunities for young hunters.

Oct. 20-21 is a statewide, two-day, youth-only deer season. The season, authorized by the FWP Commission, provides young people an opportunity to participate in a deer hunt. Legally licensed hunters ages 11-15 may hunt deer statewide. For details see the deer, elk and antelope hunting regulations.

A youth 11 years of age who will reach age 12 by Jan. 16, 2012 may also, after Aug. 15, hunt any game species for which their license is valid during an open season. They may also purchase a hunting license, except for spring turkey and spring black bear, and apply for any drawing, as long as they have proof of completing an approved hunter education course.

In certain hunting districts young people ages 12-15 may hunt elk according to specific hunting district regulations without applying for an elk permit through the drawing. The specifics on these opportunities vary, so be certain to check the hunting district regulations.

Keep in mind that young people, resident and nonresident, ages 11-13, must be accompanied by a responsible adult 18 years of age or older in order to carry or use a firearm in public.

In other incentives, youngsters who complete a hunter safety and education course are entitled to receive their first resident youth combination sports license free-of-charge.

Cody Gibson shot this elk north of Winnetta Sept. 17. He had to hike six miles one way and watched the herd of about 80 head for 1½ hours. He watched this bull elk bugle and chase off 6-7 other bull elk. The bull then walked in front of him about 40 yards away in between a two-tree clearing where he aimed and released his first shot into the neck. He walked about 20 more yards where he shot two more times to make sure his elk was down. He scored his bull which is the measuring of inches on the antlers and his scored a 342.

2011 Deer Hunting Outlook

Montana's mule deer populations are generally at or below long-term averages across the state, especially in the eastern half of the state where the winter was particularly severe. White-tailed deer numbers are generally better, with good numbers in many locations except for areas in central Montana where deer experienced an outbreak of epizootic hemorrhagic disease late this summer.

FWP surveys show mule deer experienced major population decreases in northeastern Montana in FWP Region 6, especially in hunting districts 611, 630, 652, and 670. In those districts, antlerless mule deer "B" licenses were reduced by

more than 90 percent below last year's levels in some cases. In southeastern Montana around the Miles City area, mule deer populations are below the long-term average, though white-tailed deer populations are above the long-term average.

"If the weather cooperates this fall, deer hunters overall will likely experience average hunting conditions at best," Kujala said. "The dips in deer numbers experienced in some areas due to weather-related winter losses and reduced fawn production will take some time to climb out of."

Here is a regional look at Montana's deer populations:

FWP Region 7—Southeastern Montana near Miles City

Mule deer populations are below the long-term average and white-tailed deer populations are above the long-term average.

Miles City and the surrounding area saw a severe, prolonged winter that reduced mule deer numbers and recruitment. Overall the mule deer population across the region is 12 percent below the long-term average. Recent recruitment levels, a measure of animals that survive the first year of life, averaged 41 fawns per 100 adults down from typical averages of 60 fawns per 100 adults.

Hunters Are Asked To Report Signs Of Wolves

State wildlife officials remind landowners, hikers, anglers, OHV riders and others in the outdoors this fall to report wolf sightings to Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks.

The public's sightings help verify the activity, distribution and individual pack sizes of Montana's wolf population.

To report a wolf sighting, use the form found on the FWP website at fwp.mt.gov. Information about where, when and how many wolves are seen, and if possible the GPS coordinates of a sighting is especially helpful.

Permission Is Required To Hunt On Private Land

Hunters—don't delay. Montana law requires hunters to obtain permission for all hunting on private land.

Landowners may grant permission in a face-to-face contact or over the phone, in writing or by posting signs that explain the type of hunting allowed and under what conditions.

It is a hunter's responsibility to always carry a copy of the current hunting regulations and appropriate maps to ensure that he or she knows whose land they are on or what game may be legally taken.

A Rebirth

I begin my annual rebirth in August. As the last of my client's training dogs goes home and the start of bird hunting season arrives, the process evolves. It always happens to me at some point while I'm doing my chores. I

relax my muscles from the continuous tension they have felt over the last five months of training bird dogs. But more importantly my mind starts to clear. I also begin to think about where I am this year as compared to last.

"OK", I say to myself, "here I am once again. Have I done the things this year I promised myself I would from last summer? Did I improve in my training abilities? Did I have any break-through dogs; lost souls who I helped find their way?" These and many other questions fill my mind, begging for answers I haven't had time to consider 'til now. The first stage of rebirth is reflection. You have to know where you have been before you can see where you are going. To my way of thinking a rebirth is a renewal of both the soul and the body.

So into August I go, catching up on painting the fence, or putting in the new lawn area around the kennels, things of this sort. As these chores unfold I begin to look around and really observe, not just look. Now the rebirth is in full swing but has not reached its apex until the first of September.

I experience two opening days as the bird hunting season begins. The first opener is with my wife. She will usually take a day off from work and we'll pack up a couple of our older dogs and go to a nearby field. Nothing fancy, just the two of us with our favorite dogs. Our hunt will last no more than a couple hours at most. The limiting factors this time of year are two; the heat of the day and our physical condi-

tion. Usually it becomes too hot to hunt by 10 a.m. and we are tired by then as well.

Enjoying the hunt is a vital part of the rebirth. To rejuvenate the soul, to move in harmony with nature, we have to let nature surround us with its parameters and accept them. If Joy and I were to set out to 'get a limit of birds' we would by necessity have to stretch these limits. This in turn puts an entirely different complexion on the hunt. Hunting then becomes a chore, a challenge, it takes on goals which one becomes compelled to achieve. It perverts the hunting experience.

Joy and I rarely talk during the hunt itself. The only conversation we may engage in has to do with seeing a covey of birds, or some tactical aspect involving teamwork on approaching a particular piece of cover. On this opener, Joy and I revisit our love for each other. Without words we come to remind ourselves of why we are still together after 35 years of marriage. This particular hunt isn't about shooting birds. Birds are merely a reason to walk the fields, to smell the grasses, to feel the sun. This first hunt for Joy and I is a communal rebirth, another small part of the overall process I experience each fall.

My second opener usually arrives three or four days into the bird season. I don't know exactly when it will come except it always happens during the first week.

During this week I know I will go hunting with one particular dog, just the two of us. It's important to me that the dog be the oldest one I have, it's part of the ritual.

When the day is right I grab the dog and head out. I know the hunt will be a short one. The two of us will venture forth with the bare essentials. I'll have to carry water, more for the dog than myself but appreciated by both. Other than that, I pocket only a few shotgun shells. I'll wear my lightest hunting vest, most likely a short sleeve shirt and a pair of old, trusted blue-jeans.

Once in the field, quiet is the order of the day. The advantage of taking the oldest dog is an instant recognition by that dog of what is to come. The exactness of the dog work is not a consideration at this time. It is of little consequence with older dogs. They are going to do what they are going to do and should be allowed a great deal of latitude in how they choose to go about their work. So, the whistle stays in the pocket and voice commands are kept to an absolute minimum.

The dog hits point, the bird is flushed and the gun discharged. The cycle is complete, the rebirth in place. This cycle of life flashes before my eyes. I capsule where I have been; where I am; and to a degree where I am headed. The picture is crystal clear, the understanding

unquestioned. Everything I have done throughout the year, all the experiences I have compiled over the last 12 months, every disappointment or elation I have had all come into focus in an instant and pass not before my eyes but rather before my soul.

The hunt is short as again the heat of day begins to make its play. As we head back to the truck the dog usually senses the end of the hunt even though we are a good 10-minute walk from the vehicle. Older dogs will come in at a quazi heel on their own accord. They know not only when the hunt is done, but more importantly when the experience is concluded. There is a difference.

The last element of this rebirth is to have the harvest of the day for the evening meal. This completes the appreciation of the life cycle and the rebirth. I'll not feel as I do at that moment for a year hence, and I know that each of these annual rebirths may be my last. One of these times there will be no rebirth, there will only be a closing hunt.

Mass Influenza (Flu) Shot Clinic To Be Held In Sidney

Richland County Health Department (RCHD) will hold a mass flu shot clinic at the Community Services Building on Wednesday, Oct. 12, from 10 a.m.-6:30 p.m. Medicaid, Medicare & CHIPS can be billed for those who bring their cards.

Everyone is encouraged to reduce their risk by getting a yearly flu vaccination which is the best way to prevent influenza and its severe complications. The Richland County Health Department will have plenty of vaccine available for

ages six months old through adult (99+years) at the mass clinic. No appointment is needed during the clinic.

Influenza vaccinations will be available throughout the fall and winter months since influenza activity can circulate anytime from November through April. RCHD would like to encourage all employers to send their employees to be vaccinated. Having illness from the flu can lead to lost work time for businesses. Groups may be billed—make arrangements

ahead of time by calling the health department.

The flu is caused by influenza viruses; the flu is a contagious respiratory illness with sudden onset of cough, chest discomfort, fever, chills and body aches; - **not the "stomach flu"**, which is characterized by vomiting and diarrhea. Influenza can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. Influenza can lead to pneumonia and other complications depending on your current health and medical status. Along with getting a flu vaccination, please practice good hand washing, covering your cough, and staying home when feeling ill.

Flu vaccination shot will not give you the flu, because the vaccine does not contain live virus; it is "inactivated", containing only killed virus. It may cause soreness at the site of the shot area or a slight fever but these symptoms will not last long. Before anyone receives a flu shot, they will be screened about their health status to determine whether there is any medical reason that would make vaccination not recommended. The forms can be found on the Richland County web site (richland.org/health) and may be filled out in advance for the clinic.

RCHD is planning to move patrons through quickly and efficiently. Last year they vaccinated almost 800, with a time from entrance to shot average of 12 minutes per person. This year's clinic will be staffed again by many volunteers and staff. Believe it or not the best time to come is over your lunch time! There will be plenty of parking available. Get your flu shot!

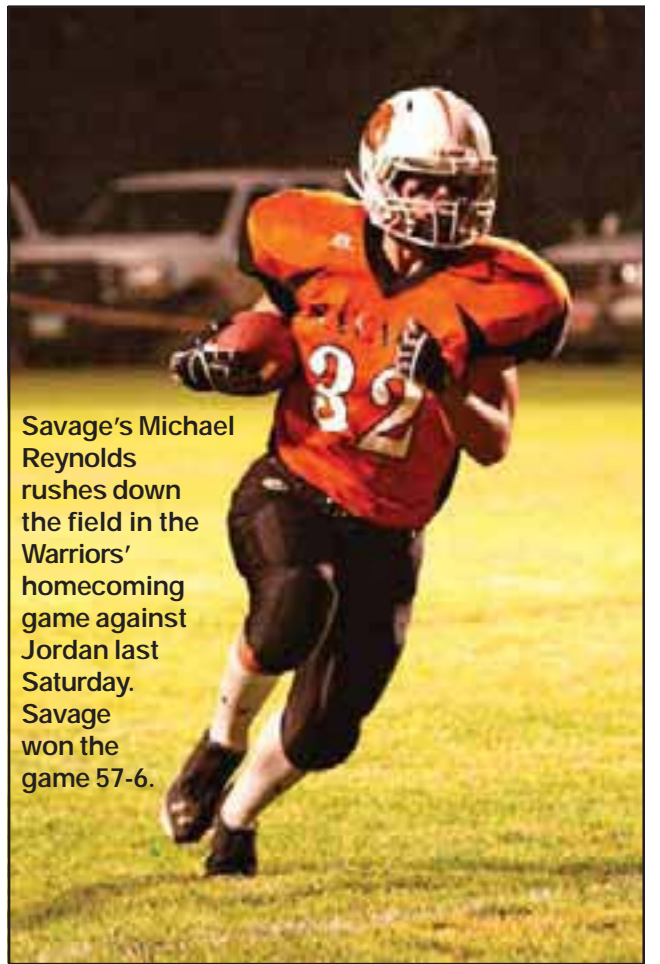
