Aug. 31 Will Be Dr. Edward Pierce's Last Day Of Practice At SHC After 29 Years At The Hospital

After 29 years of doctoring in Sidney, Dr. Edward Pierce is readying himself for retirement. Pierce, who graduated in 1968 from Andrews University in Michigan, and completed medical school at Loma Linda University in California, began his career with a residency at Charles F. Kettering Memorial Hospital in Kettering, Ohio. He spent the following 12 years in private practice with a group of doctors at the Metropolitan Medical Center in Minneapolis, MN.

It was in August of 1987 that Pierce was recruited to the Sidney hospital; initially, he had planned on doctoring in Williston, ND, however an opportunity to move to Sidney and begin

a private practice without partners presented itself. "Here I was able have an independent business, which I ran for 25 years," Pierce said, adding that he has been a hospital employee for the last 5 years. "I've enjoyed working in a small community. Many patients are looking for stability and the medical community in Sidney has been stable for a long time. Some of my patients I've been seeing for 29 years and I've seen different generations of the same families, as well."

He adds that in the last few years, many friends and hospital employees have been retiring and leaving the area. Pierce and his wife, Marie, will continue to live in Sidney and retirement will give him more time for hunting, fishing, golfing, and traveling.

"I've always enjoyed the recreation in this area, and while I enjoy practicing and will miss it, the changes implemented during the current Democratic Administration have slowed us down considerably. I used to be able to see 25 to 30 patients a day and now I can only see 18 to 20," he commented of the mandatory electronic medical records. "It takes a considerable amount of time to input the information and because of that, I need more employees, which increases the cost of operating the practice.'

Pierce will continue to serve as a Trustee for the Montana Medical Association, representing physicians in Eastern Montana and working with state legislature; the twice-yearly meetings in Helena also give him an opportunity to take his grandkids out for pizza and visit with his son, who lives in the state capital.

The avid hunter received a side-by-side shotgun as a farewell gift from Sidney Health Center, and there will be cake and coffee in the hospital cafeteria at 3 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 30 for those who would like to stop by.

A retirement party will be held on Saturday, Aug. 27 from 5 p.m. until 8 p.m. at the Elks to celebrate the physician's years of service. Dr. Pierce's last day at Sidney Health Center will be

MNAXLP **North Dakota Properties Listed In National Register Of Historic Places**

A commercial building in Williston and a school in Grand Forks have been listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The National Register of Historic Places is the federal government's list of properties it considers worthy of preservation and recognition.

The Creaser Building on the corner of Main Street and Broadway in Williston has been nominated for its architecture. Built in 1916, this striking early commercial brick building has distinct cream and red brick bands running horizontally along both street sides. It also has pilasters separating bays and diagonal blond brick centered near the top of each bay. The

building's early long-time tenants were Creaser Drug, J.B. Lyon's Women's Wear Exterior, and the Colonial Shop.

St. Michael's Parochial School in Grand Forks was built in three sections as the needs of the school and of the local community changed. The original 1916 school was designed by William J. Edwards and built by the Dinnie Brothers, and the 1949 Youth Center and the 1953 addition that connected the Youth Center to the school were designed by Ursa Louis Freed. This school complex tells the story of parochial education and shows the transition from early 20th century school architecture to mid-century modernist architecture.

Contrary to some misconceptions

about the National Register program, listing in it does not prevent owners from altering their property, restrict the use or sale of the property, or require establishing times that the property must be open to the public. Entry into the National Register of Historic Places does give a property prestige, provides protection from adverse effects in federally assisted projects, and provides eligibility for certain preservation financial incentives.

Veterinary Feed Directive Meeting Aug. 16; Rule Changes Expected Jan.

Chances are, if you are in the business of livestock production, whether it's on the nutrition side, livestock care side, or as a producer, you have heard of the changes that will be coming as a result of the Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD). I know that this may be somewhat difficult to read but below I have copied and pasted a factsheet from Rachel Endecott, our MSU Extension Beef Cattle Specialist based in Bozeman.

If you want to learn more about the VFD and what potential changes may come your way because of it, you are welcome to join Rachel, Megan VanEmon (our beef cattle specialist at Ft. Keogh) and myself for a meeting on this very topic on Tuesday, August 16 starting at 1:00 PM here at the Richland County Extension Office.

Where do these changes come from?

FDA Guidance for Industry #209

o The use of medically important antibiotics in food-producing animals should be limited to those uses that are considered necessary for assuring animal health.

- o The use of medically important antibiotics in food-producing animals should be limited to those uses that include veterinary oversight or consultation.
 - FDA Guidance for Industry #213
- o Asks drug companies to voluntarily revise product labels to remove growth promotion and feed efficiency claims.
- o Provides for moving over-the-counter products to prescription or veterinary feed directive (VFD) status.


What are "medically important" antibiotics?

• This refers to drug classes important in human medicine. Some examples are:

What is a Veterinary Feed Directive?

· A VFD consists of paperwork for the drug in question which is filled out by a veterinarian (a veterinary-client-patient relationship should be in place). It gives a description of the livestock to be treated, some instructions to the feed mill, and an expiration date.

· The feed mill must have the VFD before feed can be distributed and the feed mill must notify the FDA.

· Use of medically important feed antibiotics will need a VFD; can only be used for treatment, control, or prevention.

· Each state's regulations or veterinary board will define what is a valid veterinary-client-patient relationship

What will change as a result of these FDA

Guidances?

· Growth promotion uses in feed no longer allowed.

· Medically important water medications will move to pre-

What won't change as a result of these FDA **Guidances?**

· Use of non medically important drugs (ionophores, coccidiosis treatments) remains unchanged

· Ability to use feed-grade antibiotics labeled for treatment, rol, or prevention won't change, but will require a VFD

- · Injectable antibiotic uses remain the same.
- Extra-label use of feed-grade antibiotics remains illegal · Veterinarians should still be involved in medication de-




From Washington DC, pianist Thomas Pandolfi closes the







The *Sing Our Rivers Red* Exhibit Brings Awareness To Missing & Murdered Indigenous Women & Human Trafficking



Sing Our Rivers Red is currently on display at the MonDak Heritage Center; all of the earrings that make up the artwork belonged to a victim, or were donated by victims' families.

The Sing Our Rivers Red exhibit is on display at the MonDak Heritage Center. Made up of earrings of murdered and missing indigenous women, it serves as a beautiful and heartbreaking reminder of the violence and exploitation that occurs each and every year against these women and girls. Each earring belonged to one of the victims or was made by their families.

Since 1980, more than 1,181 native women and girls have been reported missing or murdered in Canada. Many were taken along the Highway of Tears, a 450-mile long stretch of Highway 16 between Prince George and Prince Rupert in British Columbia which has heavy truck traffic. With Richland County being so close to the Canadian border and surrounding reservations, it is important to spread awareness about the realities of human trafficking in our area.

"The first time I saw it, I got goosebumps," said Paula Eberling, victim/witness advocate with the 7th Judicial Victim Witness Program.

The 7th Judicial Victim Witness Program supports victims throughout the judicial process, and together with the Red Bird Women's Center, which serves Fort Peck, Wolf Point, and Poplar, MT, the exhibit was brought to Sidney.

"Human trafficking is rising, so it makes sense for us to partner together," Eberling commented.

Sing Our Rivers Red has been on display in Missoula and Fort Peck, MT, New Town, ND, Denver, CO, and Albuquerque, NM. Many of the victims' families have included letters about their lost loved ones, which are also on display as part of the exhibit.

Indicators of human trafficking include individuals who are accompanied by someone who is controlling, speaks for them, and/or holds all their personal information, such as ID. Individuals may seem fearful, avoid eye contact, seem confused or unable to identify their location. They may have injuries they are reluctant to discuss or be inappropriately dressed for their work or situation. Their sleeping quarters may be unsuitable and/or shared and there may be unnecessary security in or around their home, such as barricaded windows, doors they cannot unlock, barbed wire, or security cameras. If you suspect someone is a victim of human trafficking, please contact local law enforcement.

"It puts it into prospective when you look at each of the earrings that represents an individual. They did exist," Eberling said. "I feel honored that we are able to show this. The display identifies those that were lost. It represents loved ones."

The MonDak Heritage Center is open Tuesday - Friday from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m., and 1 p.m. - 4 p.m. on Saturdays; it's located at 120 3rd Ave SE in Sidney. Sing Our Rivers Red will be on display until mid-September.
