## Old Vs. New Earth

By Jerome Kessler
"Debate over the age the universe and earth and the duration of the Genesis creation days have . . . deeply divided" the Christian community. So says Hugh Ross, astronomer, pastor, and author of the book, A Matter of Days: Resolving a Creation Controversy. In his book (which was loaned to me by my son) Dr. Ross says that it is his hope that his work will "bring reconciliation" to this controversy.

Ross's book states that the scientific community almost uniformly agrees that the earth is 4.5 billion years old. This conclusion is based on analysis of radioactive uranium decay, astronomical data, etc. But many Bible readers say the earth is only about 6000 years old. That conclusion was reached, in
he $17^{\text {tn }}$ century, by John Lightfoot and James Ussher. Ussher went so far as to say that creation occurred "the week of October 18-24, 4004 B.C. [and] the creation of Adam [occurred] on October 23 at 9 a.m. $45^{\text {th }}$ meridian time." Their conclusions were made by studying Old Testament records of Hebrew genealogy.

Ross's book says tha fossils were discovered in the early 1800s - and needed to be explained. Dinosaurs and other once-living species needed to be explained. To compound the "age of the earth problem" there was the publication, in 1859, of Charles Darwin's The Origin of Species. While Darwin himself said that life has "been originally breathed by the Creator") has been widely assumed
that his theory of Evolution stands in opposition to the Garden of Eden creation story.

Dr. Ross says that early church scholars (Augustine and others) politely discussed the implications of the Genesis timeline. They realized that belief in the age of creation "has little bearing on the essential teachings about God's redemptive pro vision for repentant huma vision "or repentant human beings. It has only been in the last few hundred years however, that "young earth and "old earth" proponents have lined up against each other. They vehemently ar gue their viewpoints . . . argu ments which have driven many potential Christians from church altogether. A word-for-word interpretation of the Bible has been made a prerequisite for church
membership. Soul-searching Christians were told that they needed to ignore the scientific evidence (on the age of the earth) and accept as doctrine the "six 24 -hour day" story of creation

There is, according to Dr. Ross, a solution to this dilemma. He says that the controversy all hinges on one little word - the interpretation of the Hebrew word for day which is yom. The actual word can be "used to actual word can be "used to indicate any of four time periods: (a some portion of dayligh hours, (b) sunrise to sunset, (c) sunset to sunrise, or (d) a segment of time without any reference to solar days (from weeks to a year to several years to an age or epoch). To put it another way, Dr. Ross says that God's "six days" of creation could certainly have
human time
Some people say th "seventh day" of creation is still upon us. Dinosaurs and other species have certainly gone extinct; and new species (by cross-breeding, DNA mutation, and natural selec tion) have occasionally de veloped. But the rate at which these changes occur is exceedingly slow. Even if you accept as fact that the uni verse is extremaly old verse is extremely old (as astrophysicists believe) this is still "not ample time for a naturalist account of life" to explain where we are at today. As Dr. Ross puts it, "a 14billion year old universe is vastly too young for any conceivable natural-process scenario to yield, on its own even the simplest living or ganism." And so Dr. Ross

(along with his God-believing colleagues) believe that there must be "an 'interventionist' (that is, miraculous) aspect to life's origin and development."

Dr. Ross's book is certainly thought-provoking. He wrote it with the intention of resolving a controversy. Pat Robertson, moderator of The 700 Club, has said that Ross's book was "masterfully" written Robertson agreed that "it is entirely plau agreed that is en plau might that a day on Earth might be one thing, a solar day another, and a day in the universe another entity altogether." According to Dr. Ross, this viewpoint has the potential to bring to an end the animosity that has heretofore existed between the religious and the scientific communities.

## Richland County Accepting ECP Applications For Flood Damage Until Aug. 18

Richland County has been approved to implement the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) due to floods. Producers need to file and ECP application with the FSA before starting work on land damaged by flood water. Emergency Conservation Program is a cost share program which assists producers with damage caused by excessive rain and the floods that have occurred. Signup for the program begins on June 20, 2011 and ends Aug. 18, 2011.

A producer qualifying for ECP assistance may receive cost-share levels not to exceed $75 \%$ of the eligible cost of restoration measures. The Richland County Committee has been approved for the following conservation practices to correct damage due to the flood:

EC1 - Removing Debris from Farmland: Practice is used for removing debris from farmland. A typical example of this is taking debris off cropland and fences.

EC2 - Grading, Shaping, Releveling, or Similar Measures: Practice is used for grading, shaping, and leveling land that has been damaged by the flood and is returned to agriculture use. Example - Land has erosion caused by flood and leveling of the land is needed to restore it.

EC3 - Restoring Permanent Fences: Practice corrects damage to fences caused by the flood. Example - Fences in water gaps which have been washed out due to the high water. Cost-share is calculated up to $75 \%$ of the actual cost, after they are adjusted based on the age of the fence.

Age of fence:Allowable actual cost factor
$0-5$ years old $100 \%$ of computed cost-share
$6-10$ years old $\quad 75 \%$ of computer cost-share
11-30 years old $60 \%$ of computed cost-share
Over 30 years old $0 \%$ of computed cost-share
EC4 - Restoring Conservation Structures and Other Installations: Practice restores conservation structures and installation damaged by the flood. Example - Restoration of dams, ponds that have been destroyed by the flood.

Eligibility for cost share assistance is based on a minimum of $\$ 1,000$ of eligible damage. All requests for cost share are subject to the availability of funds. Producers are encouraged to provide the FSA office with the following data at the time of application: Location of the damage and extent of the damage, such as length of fence, time needed to remover debris, damage to land or conservation structures with estimates of cost to repair. ## ND Third Lottery Deer Application Deadline Aug. 10

Deer hunters interested in applying for a first, second, third or fourth license have to submit a third lottery application no later than Aug. 10

Successful applicants in the first lottery will receive their license in mid-August.

Hunters can apply online, or print out an application, at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's website, gf.nd.gov. Paper applications are also available from Game and Fish offices, county auditors and license vendors. Residents and nonresidents are eligible to apply.

After the third lottery drawing, Game and Fish will issue any remaining licenses on a first-come, first-served basis.

Hunters can use additional concurrent season doe
licenses during the archery season with a bow; the dee gun season with a bow, rifle, or muzzleloader; or during the muzzleloader season with a muzzleloader. These licenses are for antlerless deer only, and hunters must stay in the unit to which the license is assigned.

In addition, youth deer license hunters ages 14 and 15 may purchase additional concurrent season doe licenses to use during the youth season.

Last year, licenses were sold out in all but three units prior to opening day of deer gun season. Hunters are encouraged to apply early if they have a specific unit in mind.

The regular deer gun season starts at noon Nov. 4 and continues through Nov. 20.

## Swan Hunt Application Available Online

The online application for North Dakota's 2011 tundra swan license lottery is available on the state Game and Fish Department's website, gf.nd.gov. The deadline for applying is Aug. 17.

Paper applications will be available the week of Aug. 1 from Game and Fish offices, county auditors and license vendors. Hunters can also apply by calling 800-406-6409. A service fee is added for license applications made by phone.

The statewide tundra swan hunting season is Oct 1-Jan. 1, 2012. A total of 2,200 licenses are available. Successful applicants will receive a tag to take one swan during the season. Since swans are classified as waterfowl, nonresidents may hunt them only during the pe riod their nonresident waterfowl license is valid.

North Dakota residents and nonresidents are eligible to apply.

## Intake Fishing Access Siłe Public Drinking Water Now In Compliance

The Department of Environmental Quality has determined that public drinking water at Intake Fishing Access Site is now in compliance with DEQ human drinking water standards.

Intake Fishing Access Site has met the requirements of the Public Notice Rule as described in the Administrative Rule of Montana 17.38.239. The site is open for day use and overnight camping as flood damage has been mitigated.

## Deadline For Mountain Lion Hunters Is Aug. 31

The deadline is Aug. 31 to purchase a mountain lion hunting license for the general season, or to apply for the special limited-entry license drawing.

Mountain lion hunters may either choose to apply for a special license available through the drawing that is valid only in certain hunting dis-tricts-or they may purchase a general mountain lion license. Hunters cannot do both. Mountain lion hunting in most Montana Fish, Wildlife \& Parks Region 1 and 2 hunting districts will be only by special mountain lion licenses.

A general mountain lion license purchased over the counter after Aug. 31 may be obtained only at an FWP office or online at fwp.mt.gov under Online Services. Lion licenses purchased after Aug. 31may not be used until five days after the license is issued.

Mountain lion hunters can apply for a special license at fwp.mt.gov under Online Service, or they may apply at regional FWP office. Those who prefer to apply by mail can go to the FWP website on the Hunting page and click Licenses and Permits for a mail-in paper form.
