Alexander's 80th Annual Old Settler's Day Celebrates Tradition & Community

The 80th Annual Old Settler's Day is right around the corner, August 28-30. The McKenzie County community will be getting together for this time-honored tradition that started as a community picnic to celebrate the end of harvest.

In 1946, Lem Burns approached the Alexander Community Club offering to "furnish the critter for the barbecue" if the club would sponsor an Old Timers' picnic. The Alexander Community Club took him up on his offer, and it has been a highly anticipated event every year since. Though it started out being dubbed "Lem Burns Day", the sense of community coming together didn't change with the name.

This year Old Settler's Day honors beef sponsors Glenn and Julienne Aamodt. Glenn & Julienne have made their home together on Glenn's family homestead, where Glenn's parents Anund and Anna Aamodt lived before them.

The fun begins on Thursday, August 28, with a 5th and 6th grade tackle football game against Ray/ Powers Lake at 6 p.m. CT. There will be a Color Run/ Walk at 7 p.m. CT, with registration at 6:30 p.m., on the east side of Alexander City Park. Anyone with questions regarding the run/walk can call 970-683-0388.

The bonfire starts at 8 p.m. CT, and will supply the coals for the barbecue. Friday afternoon, the meat will be cut and seasoned with salt, pepper and onions, wrapped in butcher paper and ham bags, put into gunny sacks, and dipped in water before being thrown into the pit with half the bonfire coals on the bottom,

and the other half on top. This pit barbecue method was taught in 1947 by Fred Shipman, and has been the tradition of the celebration ever since.

Check out the Chili Cook-Off from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. CT in the Firehall parking lot. Anyone wanting to enter can call 701-793-5165.

The Soapbox Derby will be livening up Main Street at 2 p.m. Call 701-580-8338 to enter.

There will be a Car Show on the north side of the park at 3 p.m. CT, and the Cornhole Tournament will also start at 3 p.m., with registration at 2 p.m.

Swing into the Alexander Bar and Grill 9 p.m.-1 a.m. CT, for music by Colton George.

Parade registration is

open 8-10:15 a.m. CT on Saturday, with the parade starting at 11 a.m. CT. For more information call 701-793-5165. There will be vendor and craft booths set up in Alexander City Park, 11 a.m.-5 p.m. CT, and the barbecue in the park starts at noon.

The Alexander Economic Development Committee is sponsoring the Senior Citizen Social, where everyone is invited to take a break from the outdoor activity to sit down and visit, located at the north end of the park.

No one will want to miss the Red Neck Olympics at 2 p.m. CT, which include a 3 point shootout, cornhole, horseshoes, a slip 'n slide relay and mud volleyball, all located neat the bonfire pit. There is \$100 registration fee per 4-man team, and participants must be 18 or older. Teams must be registered by Monday, August 25 by calling 701-570-5958.

The good-times continue with a street dance, 9 p.m.-1 a.m., on Main Street, with music by "Sideways".

"It's history," commented Brittni Hatter, committee member. "This is the 80th one and it's a good way to remember the community. It was a way to get together and enjoy each other's company when it started, and it's a way to honor that tradition."

Sidney City Council Addresses SHC Additional Parking

Sidney Parks & Recreation Committee held a meeting Monday, Aug. 4, with Johnson Park-SHC request for parking spots on the agenda.

Among those in attendance were Jen Doty, Sidney Health Center (SHC) CEO; and Melissa Boyer, Foundation for Community Care (FFCC) director; and Bill Evanson, SHC Facilities planner; who were there to discuss potentially designating a portion of Johnson Park, located at the corner of 5th St. SW and 14th Ave SW, for additional hospital parking.

The idea had been discussed in May by Stephanie Ridl, Sidney City Parks superintendent; Jeff Hintz, Sidney Public Works director; SHC and the FFCC with hopes that the project could possibly be collaborated between the city, SHC and potentially Richland County. Ideas included parking for Johnson Park itself, SHC, and an over-flow parking option for the Richland County Fair.

It isn't the first time using green space from Johnson Park for parking has been considered. It was first brought up when Richland County Boys & Girls Club was looking to relocate, and then again considered in 2019/2020 for hospital parking, at which time the decision was made to develop SHC's south parking lot.

In the interest of saving time and money, Interstate Engineering offered up layout plans they'd designed for the previously mentioned projects, with the intention of it simply being a place to start and something to bring before the Parks and Recreation Committee to begin discussions.

The layout presented allowed for 77 parking spaces in a parking lot that would run along 4th St. SW, and 14th Ave. SW, using approximately 4,460 square yards of Johnson Park. The cost estimate presented was approximately \$630,000.

Things to take into consideration include a well which is located in the park, and has a "cone of influence" that cannot have developments obstructing it, though the layout does accommodate that. Also, Johnson Park had new playground equipment installed about a year-and-a-half ago. The Elevated Fitness Court was installed in 2020, with plans for it to double in size.

The meeting was attended by several home owners who live near Johnson Park, and voiced a variety of their own concerns, including their personal use of the park, the fact that is a highly used park, holds soccer and flag football practices, and is used by an adult volleyball league. Additional concerns included lighting needed for a parking lot, which would shine into surrounding homes at night and also interfere with watching 4th of July fireworks set off at the fairgrounds; snowplows disrupting residents with bright lights and loud scraping noises; and questions about how a parking lot could impact the value of homes in the area.

One resident suggested a parking garage be built where SHC's south parking lot is, though Evanson noted the cost of a parking structure is about \$12,000 per parking space. Another questioned why the green space south of Extended Care couldn't be used.

Ryan Kopp, Interstate Engineering, later explained, "Drainage from that location goes to the Montana Department of Transportation (Holly St.), and they don't want more storm water. If you are taking away the grass and adding concrete, there will be more storm water. The city doesn't allow underground storm water drainage in the area of influence of a well, which there is in Johnson Park."

Ridl mentioned during the meeting that the current parking is inadequate for park use alone. She proposed off-street parking along 4th St. SW and 14th Ave. SW, that would allow cars to pull into parking spaces from the street, and would have a much smaller footprint than the parking lot, creating 30-40 parking spots.

"We want to be good neighbors and do our best to have adequate off-street parking. This was an option to explore that. It wasn't just a meeting about benefiting the hospital. We wanted to discuss options that could benefit the city, county and community," Boyer stated.

"I was surprised by people's reactions," Kopp said of watching the meeting video. "There wasn't an 'ask' at Monday night's meeting. Sidney Health Center wasn't asking for a decision to be made. It's not even ready for an 'ask'."

Cargo & Steer, Daffy, Sweep Competition At ND State Fair

Dylan Cargo and his steer, Daffy, proudly swept all market steer competitions during the North Dakota State Fair in Minot, July 18-25.

The 17-year-old senior at Alexander High School has been a member of the Ragged Butte Rough Riders 4-H club for the last eight years, though he started showing steers at the state fair when he was just 6 years-old.

Daffy, a Chi-Maine Shorthorn Cross, weighing in at 1,431 lbs., was awarded Supreme in the Open Show, which can be entered by any age and from any state, Junior Show, which can be entered by anyone 21 and under from any state, and the 4-H Show, which is open to 4-H members throughout North Dakota.

"I've spent a lot of time in the show barn dreaming of something like this. I was always told all the hard work would pay off, and it was worth all the hours. It's a dream come true," Cargo said.

All of the steers Cargo has shown throughout the years have been born and raised on his family's ranch, which has also come with the benefit of having a little help when needed. If Cargo couldn't be at home, his parents were able to feed and take care of him. During competitions, if Cargo needed help fitting, family members and friends were always willing to help him out.

"They are fun to work with," he said of the steer. "I like to show them, fit them... I like the whole process," he commented, and explained that "fitting" includes washing, drying and grooming the animal, along with using hair products to keep Daffy looking his best.

All hard work comes with challenges, and Cargo noted

that the hardest part with Daffy was halter breaking him, though once he was halter broke, he was probably the best steer he'd had on a halter.

Daffy was sold at the McKenzie County Fair to Badlands Hydrovac Services, J Custom Electric, Lawlar Angus, Northern States Fishing Tools, and United Quality Cooperative.

"This will be the hardest one to let go," he admits. "I like this one a lot."

For Cargo, Daffy will always hold a special place in his memories as the steer who beat out competition from all over the state of North Dakota to take Supreme three times over. Daffy will always be a big part of Cargo's dreams coming true.



Johnston's Blankets For Preemies Number Over 300

At 95 years old, Beverly Johnston remains as spry and sharp as ever, living in her own immaculate remote Richland County home. The day before this interview, she had picked chokecherries and made jelly! She was born just eight miles away and attended school in Richey where she met her husband, Johnnie.

Beverly learned to sew making diapers for their first child and has

never stopped. In 2021, she began making baby blankets for preemies in Africa. So far, she has donated over 300 and has 17 more ready to go. The blankets are part of a mission through the Christian Missionary Alliance Church in Richey which also gives a onesie, a hood, and booties in a one-gallon bag. "There are lots of newborns," Beverly said. "They need lots of blankets."

In the mid '50s, after

moving to her current home, Beverly started quilting. She has made beautiful quilts for all her children, grandchildren and great grandkids. Unfortunately, the quilting came to an end after knee surgery meant she could no longer use her quilt frame and Johnie's passing meant she no longer had him to roll the quilts tightly. Gorgeous quilts are on display in Beverly's home with perhaps the prettiest one (my

opinion) featuring hand cross stitched squares, quilted to perfection.

Beverly's talents also include meticulous embroidery evidenced by the multiple sets of pillow cases and Day of the Week dish towel sets she has created over the years.

Beverly and Johnnie were married for 70 years, farming and ranching together and raising two daughters and four sons. They started their life together on a farm

just west of Richey, then rented her parent's farm in 1949 until they moved to the current place in the early 1950s. Beverly often would help with the field work, then come home and do chores, including milking the cows, then still make dinner and do her household tasks. The house came with electricity and they put in running water in 1956 or 57. Telephone service came in the early 1960s. "I thought I had really done something, to have

electricity and running water," she said. "Before that I pulled it in with a wagon with two little boys trailing behind." Her children are now in their 60s and 70s with one son farming the land.

Beverly's sewing machine was at Ribbon & Rail for repairs at the time of this interview. However, by now she has the machine back, along with more soft flannel fabric, and is busy making even more blankets for those needy newborns in Africa.



New Summit Carbon Solutions CEO Teases 'Updates' To Business Plan In **Letter To Landowners**

northdakotamonitor.com Summit Carbon Solutions has a new CEO, Joe Griffin, who authored letters this week to signed and unsigned landowners along the carbon pipeline project

Two versions of the letter, one dated Aug. 4 and the other dated Aug. 5, noted the company would be announcing "several updates" that would "open new markets and create greater opportunities for the region." The letters also note Summit has a new senior leadership

The version addressed to landowners along the route who have not signed an easement agreement said they should expect a "revised Right of Way proposal in the coming weeks."

The letter said the revised proposals would reflect Summit's "commitment to offering terms that better support landowners and their long-term interests."

The other version was addressed to landowners

who had already signed easements and instead thanked them for their trust in the company and its project to build a carbon sequestration line across lowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota.

Griffin wrote in the letter he wanted to "set the tone" for a "fresh chapter" for Summit.

In addition to Griffin's replacement of former CEO Lee Blank, the letter notes Summit has a "new senior leadership team" that is focused on "partnership and respect."

"This team has constructed and/or operated more than 4,700 miles of pipelines, but what I'm most proud of is that we did it safely, working closely with landowners, communities, and emergency responders to ensure the safety of all," Griffin said.

Griffin said he has spent his career in "energy infrastructure" though it is unclear what company the new CEO was with formerly.

"I'm the kind of person

His work has been recognized for bridging the gap between classroom instruction and real-world workforce needs.

He has already been active this summer, participating in the Lignite Energy Council's and the North Dakota Petroleum Foundation's annual Teacher Education Seminars, each held on separate weeks in June. Brink had the opportunity to tour coal mines, a drilling rig, and other energy facilities, using this opportunity to collaborate with industry partners while planning for the school year ahead. 

A typical day for Le-


