

This Weekend

The two-day NDRA Rodeo Finals event will feature the talents of North Dakota's top 12 competitors in nine events, as they try to become the 2013 NDRA State Champion.

The event is taking place Sept. 13 - 14 with rodeo action starting at 7:00 p.m. Go-around prizes will be awarded to each night's top contestants. The beer garden opens Friday at 6:00 p.m.

Other events are scheduled for Saturday including the Watford City High School Club Rodeo at 9:00 a.m. along with a team roping event to follow at 10:00 a.m.

The Saturday NDRA deo again starts at 7:00 p.m. with champions crowned during the evening performance.

Even if you're an avid rodeo-goer, this particular venue offers something a little different from your average outdoor arena. "Watching the rodeo indoors really gets you up close to the action. Many of these competitors are amateur performers who go professional. When you mix that with some of the best rodeo stock there is, watching it all from 50 feet away is really a good time," said Gene Veeder, a NDRA Rodeo Finals Committee member.

This year marks the celebration of 60 years of the North Dakota Rodeo Association with this being the 15th annual event taking place in Watford City.

"This has become one of North Dakota's premier western events, a place where you can meet most of North Dakota's amateur and high school rodeo contestants and fans in one big weekend of activities. Watford City has also added several new motels and an expanded shopping district so it should be an exciting new look for visitors," Veeder said.

Money generated from this event is part of an annual fundraiser that benefits a number of area organizations, including the Eagles Club, McKenzie County 4-H and the Oilers Hockey Club.

Rodeo stock were chosen by judges and performers and selected from a wide variety of stock contractors to help ensure the best competition.

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department is currently working with 18 landowners in 16 hunting units across the state who would like to host hunters with antlerless deer licenses in 2013.

Participating landowners are located in hunting units 2C, 2G2, 2I, 2J2, 2K2, 3A4, 3B3, 3C, 3D1, 3D2, 3E1, 3E2, 3F1, 3F2, 4B and 4E.

The program is not intended for buck hunters, but designed to direct hunters with antlerless licenses to specific areas to reduce deer populations.

Interested hunters can get their name on a list of possible participants by accessing the Game and Fish Department's website at <u>gf.nd.gov</u>. Hunters who do not have Internet access can call the department's main office in Bismarck at (701) 328-6300.

Hunters will provide their address, hunting unit(s) where they hold valid antlerless licenses, and if using rifle, muzzle-

loader or bow. From this list the department will select the number of hunters landowners have agreed to host. These hunters will be sent the landowner's name, phone number and any information relating to the landowner's specific situation.

Hunters must have a valid 2013 deer gun license – the Game and Fish Department does not provide a hunting license with this program.

Not everyone who signs up will end up with a new place to hunt, because not everyone's schedule will match up with a landowner's, and more people will likely put their name on the list than there are openings. Currently, participating landowners have openings for about 170 doe hunters.

North Dakota's 2013 regular deer gun season runs from Nov. 9-25. In addition, the archery season extends through Jan. 5, 2014; the youth season is Sept. 20-29; and muzzle-loader runs from Nov. 29 – Dec. 15.



MDT Proposes Bridge Deck Repair Projects For Seven Bridges Near Glendive and Intake, MT in Dawson County

The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) would like to notify the public and seek comments on a proposal to rehabilitate and repair seven bridge decks in the Glendive and Intake, Montana areas of Dawson County

The bridges are at the following locations:

Thirteen Mile Creek -One mile southwest of Intake on Montana Highway 16 - Reference Marker 15.5

Dry Creek (Eastbound) - West Glendive on Montana Highway 200 - Reference Marker 326.2

Dry Creek (Westbound) - West Glendive on Montana Highway 200 - Reference Marker 326.2

Yellowstone River -Glendive on Montana Highway 200 (Towne Street) - Reference Marker 328 1

East Glendive Interchange - East Glendive on

Highway 200 (Merrill Avenue) - Reference Marker 329.5

Upper Seven Mile Creek (Eastbound) - One mile southwest of Glendive on U.S. Highway 98 (West Towne Street) - Reference Marker 1.0

Upper Seven Mile Creek (Westbound) - One mile southwest of Glendive on U.S. Highway 98 (West Towne Street) - Reference Marker 1.0

Proposed work includes repairing and either resurfacing or sealing the existing bridge decks and upgrading the bridge rail and guardrail approaches where appropriate. The purpose of the project is to extend the service life of the bridges, as well as, enhance travel safety.

The project is tentatively scheduled for construction in 2015, depending on completion of all project development activities and availability of funding.

No new Right-of-Way or utility relocations will be needed.

This program is offered by the North Dakota State University Extension Service and classroom training will be provided by professionals in their respective fields. Upon completion of the Master Gardener Program, participants will be well schooled in the basics of plant and soil science, perennial and annual flowers, plant pathology, entomology, and weed control, vegetable and fruit production and more.





Licensed residents ages 12 and 13, and 11-year-olds who turn age 12 in 2013, are allowed to hunt statewide, but only for antlerless white-tailed deer. Resident deer gun hunters age 14 or 15, and 13-year-olds who turn age 14 in 2013, with a "youth season" license, can

Friday, Sept. 20 at noon hunt statewide for any deer, except antlerless mule deer in units 3B1, 3B2, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D, 4E and 4F. In addition, a special license is required to hunt antlered mule deer in those same units.

> After opening day, hunting hours are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. Solid daylight fluorescent orange vests or coats, and hats are required for all young hunters

and their adult mentors.

Each youth deer hunter must be under direct supervision of an adult while in the field.

In addition to the deer license, hunters must possess a general game and habitat license and hunting certificate.

The youth deer season closes Sunday, Sept. 29.







First Human Case of West Nile Virus Confirmed in Yellowstone County

The Yellowstone City-County Health Department and the Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services are reporting the first human case of West Nile Virus (WNV) in Yellowstone County and in Montana for 2013.

The case was diagnosed at a Billings hospital and confirmed last week. The patient, a Yellowstone County female resident in her fifties, did not require hospitalization and is expected to fully recover. The individual had no history of travel outside the state within the past month.

"West Nile Virus is most commonly found in people over 50 years old, but every Montanan should be taking precautionary measures to help prevent WNV infection," said DPHHS Director Richard Opper.

In the U.S. this year, 497 human cases of WNV have been reported to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Of these cases, twenty have died.

The first indication of the presence of WNV in Montana this year occurred in mid-July when mosquitoes with WNV were found in Prairie County.

The first WNV positive bird was also detected at that time in Sheridan County. Horses with WNV infection were reported in late August from counties in central and eastern parts of the state.

Most people who become infected with WNV experience no symptoms. Some individuals may develop a mild illness, called West Nile fever, which may last for three to six days. Other individuals, fewer than 1 out of 150, may become severely infected with West Nile encephalitis or West Nile meningitis. Symptoms of this disease may include headache, rash, high fever, stiff neck, mental confusion, muscle weakness, tremors, convulsions, coma and paralysis. There is no available treatment for WNV infection other than supportive care. Individuals who develop any of these symptoms should see their healthcare provider.

DPHHS reminds Montanans to take precautions and protect against West Nile Virus by following the 5 Ds of WNV prevention.

IV prevention.
The 5 Ds include:

DUSK/DAWN - mosquitoes are most active during this time. If possible, stay indoors during the early morn-

ing and evening hours.

If you must be outdoors when mosquitoes are most active, DRESS in long sleeves and pants.

Before going outdoors, remember to apply an insect repellent containing 25 to 35 % DEET when outdoors. Children ages 2-12 should use repellent with 10 percent DEET or less. DEET is recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and is the most effective and best studied insect repellent available. Products containing picaridin and permethrin have also been found to be effective in repelling mosquitoes, as has oil of lemon eucalyptus.

To keep the mosquito population at bay around your home, DRAIN standing water in old tires, barrels, buckets, cans, clogged rain gutters, and other items that collect water. Change water in pet bowls, flowerpots, and birdbaths at least twice a week.







Sidney Health Center was recently recognized for 20 years of excellence in telemedicine services as a member of the Eastern Montana Telemedicine Network.

The Eastern Montana Telemedicine network is a mature telemedicine delivery system, providing the provision of medical care in 37 rural and frontier Montana communities. Currently, medical and mental health services comprise 71% of all network activity. Over 80 specialists and clinicians provide care in 21 specialty areas including: cardiology, oncology, nephrology, dermatology, pulmonary, rheumatology, physical medicine and rehab, neurology, genetics counseling, geriatrics, diabetes care, dietician services.

These medical consultations often save rural Montana residents in out-of-pocket travel expenses. In addition, mental health encounters are a vital service of the telemedicine network. With no psychiatrists practicing east of Billings, MT, access to telemental health service is critical. The availability of mental health services is truly a life line for rural and frontier residents in Montana.

"Telemedicine also gives our nurses at Sidney Health Center an opportunity to do continuing education online. We need 24 credits every two years," commented Judy Reid, telemedicine LPN. "Being able to do education here is essential to keeping our license requirements up-to-date."

Earlier this summer, the USDA designated rural development grant funds for telemedicine equipment that extended specialty medical services such as dermatology, allergy care and ear, nose and throat care to 16 rural communities in eastern Montana, including Sidney. Billings Clinic was the recipient of the \$295,117 grant through the USDA that helped place equipment in these facilities and extend the specialty medical services.

Sidney Health Center continues to expand and offer telemedicine services to area residents as a community health benefit. Supporting the health and vitality of rural communities and the people who live and work in them is a top priority of the Eastern Montana Telemedicine Network. This service allows individuals who choose the rural lifestyle the opportunity to access comprehensive, high-quality health care in their home communities. Telemedicine connects communities across the miles to a robust, secure and sustainable healthcare network.
