



# A Little Bit Country Beef Herd Expansion On Hold

With record high calf prices in 2011, a growing export market and a strong domestic consumption of beef products, most reports indicated there would be an expansion of the U.S. cow herd. Even though moisture conditions in the southern states have improved, it has not been enough to encourage retention of heifers or purchase of breeding age cows.

We are all familiar with the drought conditions throughout the Midwest. Last year the northern plains was a good source of hay shipped to the south. However, this year is a different story. Although hay yields of this area are maybe a quarter to a third of last year, yields in parts of southern North Dakota are less. Hay prices are digging deep into the profits of cattlemen of Wyoming, South Dakota, Iowa and South.

## Law Enforcement to Increase Patrols Throughout Holiday Week

The Montana Department of Transportation encourages all Montanans to not only think about the safety of themselves but also about the safety of others while traveling on Montana roads.

During the upcoming National Labor Day Campaign from August 20 – September 3, Montana law enforcement agencies will increase patrols to help keep roads, drivers, families and tourists safe by reminding motorists that driving impaired and not buckling up increases the risks of traveling.

"Alcohol-related crashes account for 44 percent of all Montana's traffic fatalities over the last five years," said Montana Department of Transportation Director Tim Reardon. "We need to reverse this trend immediately and make sure that the Labor Day holiday does not turn disastrous for someone's loved ones."

As Labor Day weekend approaches, preliminary reports indicate an increase in alcohol-related fatalities compared to this time in 2011. As of August 13, there have been 36 alcohol-related fatalities on Montana roads — that is 13 more fatalities than this time last year.

The Montana Department of Transportation is committed to keeping Montana roadways safe this Labor Day holiday by combining high-visibility law enforcement with increased public awareness and reminding people to PLAN for a safe ride home.

For planning tools and tips for a safe, sober ride home go to plan2live.mt.gov, which include:

• Designate a driver or volunteer to be the designated driver. Text or Facebook message with friends and family before the celebration about who is going to be the designated driver.

• Arrange for a pick up. Have a friend or family member who isn't drinking lined up to pick you up at the end of the party or night.

• Call a cab or ride home service. The plan2live website lists available services throughout the state.

 $\bullet$  Crash on the couch if no ride is available — better than crashing on the road.

• Know your limit. Before you start drinking, download a blood alcohol calculator — available for most smartphones, including iPhone, Android and Blackberry. These are not exact, but provide people an idea how few drinks it takes to be impaired.

Driving impaired and not wearing your seatbelt is not worth it — you could lose everything. Make the right choice and arrive alive.

These conditions are forcing some producers to sell cows in order to have enough pasture for others and minimize winter feed costs.

Cow slaughter has been ample the past three months. This could possibly mean fewer cows available during the normal fall and early winter months when cows are normally culled.

The current 50 year drought of the Midwest has resulted in a big "hit" on calf prices which have dropped more than \$35/cwt. since early June. Some market experts believe a further significant price drop of feeder calves will not happen. An improvement in moisture conditions in the south will enhance fall and winter grazing which could push calf prices above current levels.

Even with favorable moisture conditions, it will take two to three years to recover from this major disaster. During a recovery, demand for all classes of cattle will be high.

#### Tree of the Week

Ornamental Crabapples are a group of small flowering trees used for landscape plantings. They are valued for their foilage, flowers, fruits, and variations in form and size.


In most environments flowering crabs will reach 15-25 feet in height and they will have a similar crown spread. They tend to prefer soils that are a bit on the acid side of the pH scale, however, most seem to accept the alkaline levels typical of this area.

Like most other trees, they prefer well drained, moist soils but they do have some tolerance to drought situations, depending on parentage of the hybrid.

Many people think of crabapple as being messy because of the dropping small sized fruit. However, there are several cultivated hybrids with fruit less than a quarter inch in diameter which make good food for birds.


I think most people value flowering crabapple for its flower color which can be white to pink to red, depending on the variety. Varieties such as Adams, Centzan, Centurion, Indian Majic, Indian Summer, Selkirk and Red Splendor produce rosy-pink flowers and small, cherry-red retentive, nonmessy fruit. Beverly, Glen Mills, Hunter Gem and Donald Wyman produce white flowers, small purplish-red fruit and purple foilage. Spring Snow produces white flowers and no fruit. Canary produces white flowers and pea-sized, nonretentive yellow fruit. Cardinal, Purple Price, and Thunderchild produce rosy-lavender flowers, small purplishred fruit and purple foilage.

Besides the messy large fruit of some varieties, the downside of flowering crab is susceptibility to fireblight. However, in some varieties there is some resistance due to an antibacterial substance found in the leaves.





# **Comment Sought on Fishing Regulation Changes**

The Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks Commission is seeking comment on proposed changes to 2013 fishing regulations

The proposed changes to current regulations are listed below.

#### **Central District**

Changes in the Centennial Valley include:

Elk Lake allow catch-and-release angling only for Arctic grayling.

Red Rock Creek and Widgeon Pond expand cutthroat trout harvest opportunities.

Upper Red Rock Creek allow catch-and-release angling only for Arctic grayling and expand cutthroat trout harvest opportunities

Yellowstone River eliminates the exception that allows two lines with two hooks per line all year from the mouth of the Clarks Fork River to the I-90 Bridge at Billings.

#### Eastern District

Fort Peck Reservation Tribal Boundary Water changes the catfish harvest in the regulations so it is consistent with Tribal and Montana fishing regulations.

The proposed changes are available for review and comment on the FWP website at fwp.mt.gov. Click "Fishing" and then look under "Opportunities for Public Comment".

Comments may also be mailed to Fisheries Bureau, Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks, P.O. Box 200701; Helena, MT 59601. Comments may also be emailed to fwpfsh@mt.gov.

Comments must be received by Sept. 5. The FWP Commission is scheduled to take final action on the fishing regulations in October.

### **PLOTS Guide Available Online** The North Dakota Game and Fish Department's Private

Land Open To Sportsmen Guide for 2012 is now available online at the Department's website, gf.nd.gov. In addition, PLOTS Guides will be available at most license vendors throughout the state in late August.

The guide will feature about 840,000 PLOTS acres. Because the guide is printed in mid-August, some PLOTS tracts highlighted in the guide may have been removed from the program since the time of printing. There will also be some PLOTS tracts where the habitat and condition of the tract will have changed significantly. Conversely, Game and Fish may have added new tracts to the program after the guide went to press.

To minimize possible confusion, Game and Fish will update PLOTS map sheets weekly on its website.

Hunters can also view the guide, and find a list of vendors where guides are available, on the website.

The PLOTS Guide features maps highlighting these walk-in areas, identified in the field by inverted triangular yellow signs, as well as other public lands.

The guides are free, and available at county auditor offices and license vendors in the state; by walk-in at the Game and Fish Department's Bismarck office; and at district offices in Riverdale, Harvey (Lonetree), Williston, Dickinson, Jamestown and Devils Lake.

The guides are not available to mail, so hunters will have to pick one up at a local vendor, or print individual maps from the website.

# Yellowjackets Becoming A Nuisance

Hornets are starting to annov homeowners by swarming or building nests in homes or in trees near houses, according to Janet Knodel, North Dakota State University Extension Service entomologist.

Hornets (or yellowjackets) are wasps that belong to the Vespidae family.

"All yellowjackets sting, and their stinging behavior is considered a defensive reaction when the colony is threatened," Knodel says. "They can sting more than once because their stinger stays with the insect."

Yellowjackets are more aggressive during August and September and more likely to sting people. Although vellowjackets are a beneficial insect feeding on other insects, they often become a pest problem when their nests are near homes, schools, picnic areas or playgrounds. When that happens, pest control often is warranted.

Wasps are social insects and build nests of paperlike material. Nests generally are underground in mammal burrows, cavities or behind the siding of a house.

Vespid wasps are active outside the nest during the daylight hours. Nearly the entire colony is in the nest during the evening and nighttime hours, so control measures should be applied to the nest at that time. There are many insecticides labeled for control of hornets and yellowjackets.

"The difficulty is making the treatment without being stung," Knodel says. "Usually an aerosol spray of one of the many fast-acting wasp killers will quickly kill all the workers present in a nest."

Products that contain permethrin, synergized pyrethrins or pyrethroid insecticides such as esfenvalerate or lambda cyhalothrin will get rid of wasps.

A slower-acting insecticidal approach is to apply carbaryl (Sevin) dust directly onto the exposed nest and entrance hole. After treatment, check the nest for any activity the following day and do another treatment if necessary.

Nests should be removed to avoid attracting dermestid beetles later and keep wasp pupae from possibly re-establishing the nest.

"If you are dealing with yellowjacket nests in structures such as a home, the nest entrance should never be plugged from the outside," Knodel says. "If constrained, yellowjacket workers cannot escape to the outside, so they may locate or chew a new way to escape toward the inside of the home or structure. This would create a possible stinging threat for people inside."

When outside enjoying a picnic, avoid wearing bright colors and perfumes that are attractive to hornets and yellowjackets. Also, keep garbage away from the picnic table.

In northern temperate climates, only the mated queen

wasp overwinters from the previous year's colony. Queens are inactive during the winter and hide in protected places such as under tree bark or attics.

In early spring, the overwintering queen builds a new nest and lays an egg in each cell. Larvae hatch from the eggs and are dependent on the queen for food. The queen forages outside the nest and brings food (caterpillars and other insects) back to the larvae until pupation.

Sterile female workers emerge from the pupae and take over nest building and brood rearing, while the queen stays in the nest. During late summer into early fall, adult males and newly produced queens leave the parent colony. The colony dies off and only newly mated queens will find a protected place to overwinter.




