

LYIP Begins Rocking Process of the Intake **Diversion Dam**

The critical rocking process of the Intake diversion dam by Lower Yellowstone Irrigation began August 7 and should be completed in about a week. In 2012, the last year when rocking was permitted, 1500 cubic yards of sandstone boulders were used to bring the height up to 2.5' above the dam. The 2012 rocking was extensive after the flooding of 2011. This year, the ice jams removed all the rock from the top of the dam. However, LYIP manager James Brower said the river seems to be responding faster this year so less rock may be needed.

Rocking was not permitted in 2013 and water dropped below the full water right level. This year, rocking was delayed by negotiations with the Montana State Historical Preservation office. By August 6, water was at 1.7' above the dam with the gates 100% open. Once rocking began, the water level immediately started to rise and by August 8, the level was 2' above

The Lone Tree Gun Show took place this past weekend at the Richland County Fair Event Center. Helmed by Leanne Pelvit and Brenda Larson, the show, which started out as a fundraiser for the Sidney Chamber of Commerce, has now entered its 24th year. "Last year the event raised money for the 4H rifles for shooting sports. This year the Boys and Girls Club of Sidney and Hunter Safety will be benefiting from the show." Larson says.

Lonetree's popularity has grown through the years and demand to present here is high. With 160 tables offered, the show sells out very quickly and the waiting list is very long. Last year there were approximately 1200 people who came through the doors. This year, even with a torrential downpour on Friday night, Larson and Pelvit believe it will be up to 1500 people to visit by the end of Sunday.

People travelled hundreds of miles from across Montana and Wyoming to be here. Most of these vendors have been coming here for years, some since its inception like Claire Stoner or Midge and Sandy Siefert from Glasgow. "We are very close to many of the vendors. They are like our family. They have watched our children grow and we're always so happy to see them

"Our first show was held in the Armory building and after a few years we switched to the old commercial building. Now we are in the Event Center, which is at least double the size," said Larson, "It's nice to have the space but also air conditioning and a kitchen

Leanne Pelvit who has helped Larson organize the event for years now, states, "It takes a lot to put this together, but we have always been fortunate to have people volunteer their time and help make it a success." Larson agrees, "We can't thank everyone enough. Both our husbands,





our friends and our children share their time to volunteer or "volun-told" as our kids like to put it. Brent Coon has been with us since day one and Deniece Schwab is our chief cook. They are just wonderful people and a great help."

Just as you would expect there were guns, guns and more guns of course, but surprisingly, it was an eclectic blend of other wares as well. As you walked by the tables, new and old rifles, shotguns, handguns, revolvers and ammunition were displayed with much care, but this is also the place to come if you are looking for antiques or collectibles. Things that you might not find at Cabella's or some other sporting store. One gun, a Parker 28 gauge, owned by Mick Peabody of Great Falls, was priced at \$20000.00. At another table, rented by Kirk and Carol Harshman, there was a beautiful and intricately designed gun belt. Made from leather and housing two .45 colts and curved five inch blade with an ivory handle. Completely hand made and never used.

Interspersed throughout the guns you could also find knives of various size,

jewelery, homemade or new, collectible coins, rugs, kitchen wares, samurai swords, toys and various knick-knacks. There was a little something for everyone here. Even if you came just to look, the vendors were excited to talk about their

The gun show also gave some Sidney natives a chance to display their talents. Patti Schwenke's table was full of her homemade Rosarys. Kevin Lake offered hand crafted custom made knives and pens. David McDonald, a science teacher at the High School in Sidney, had a display of Japanese swords. Some from WWI and another that dated back as far as the 1400s. McDonald buys and sells, repairs and appraises these swords.

Both Larson and Pelvit want the people of Sidney to know if there is a cause or a need for fundraising to give them a call. "We are always looking to help. Another Year of **Record ND Fishing License Sales**

The number of anglers buying fishing licenses in North Dakota continues to increase, as 2013-14 is the second consecutive year a new record for license sales has been established.

Statistics compiled by the Game and Fish Department revealed more than 219,000 fishing licenses were sold last year, an increase of 1,000 from 2012-13. A record total of 160,100 resident and 59,300 nonresident fishing licenses were sold last year.


In terms of actual individuals participating in fishing, the past year was again record-setting with more than 203,000 active anglers. Ice fishing activity experienced a substantial increase, while open water angler days took a slight dip.

A record number of fishing lakes (many at all-time elevations) and aggressive fish management in North Dakota have helped produce record fishing license sales.

Lake Sakakawea, Devils Lake and Lake Oahe/Missouri River remained the top three fisheries in the state.





Nonresident Travel Spending Contributes to NE Montana Counties and Travel Regions

Submitted by Norma Nickerson, director, UM Institute for Tourism and Recreation Research

An analysis recently completed by the Institute for Tourism and Recreation Research at the University of Montana highlights the economic contribution of nonresident travel spending to each of the six travel regions in Montana, as well as 18 of the state's 56 counties.

Estimates of the economic contribution of traveler spending at the statewide level showed that 11.02 million visitors spent approximately \$3.62 billion in 2013, which directly supported \$2.8 billion of economic activity and over 33,000 Montana jobs.

Nonresident travelers indirectly support an additional \$1.6 billion of economic activity and 14,600 jobs. Associated with those travel-related jobs is \$979 million in labor income directly attributable to nonresident travel and another \$525 million indirectly attributable to nonresident spending.

Focusing on the \$105 million spent by nonresident travelers in the northeastern part of the state, \$63 million of economic

activity and 830 jobs are directly supported in Missouri River Country Travel Region. An additional \$22 million of economic activity and 200 jobs are indirectly supported. A total of \$24 million in labor income is directly attributable to nonresident spending, supplemented by an additional \$7 million indirectly supported by traveler spending.

Richland County, located within Missouri River Country was included in the analysis. A total of \$32 million of economic activity in Richland County was directly supported by the \$56 million spent in the county, with an additional \$9 million supported indirectly. Spending in the county directly supported 390 jobs and nearly \$14 million in labor income, with an additional 90 jobs and \$3 million in labor income being indirectly supported.

The full report, including estimates of the economic contribution of nonresident traveler spending in the other five Montana travel regions, as well as additional county-level estimates is



Celebrate Equal Suffrage by Protecting Your Right to Register and Vote on Election Day

Women across the state are preparing to vote in the General Election on November 4. Current law secures their right — and the right for every voter — to register and cast a ballot through the close of polls on Election Day. It's a fundamental liberty that should be secured and protected as we celebrate 100 years of victories in the women's suffrage movement, and the freedom for all Americans to participate in elections.

On November 3, 1914, Montana voters granted full voting rights to non-Native women. The 19th Amendment was ratified on August 18, 1920. When American Indian women gained access to the ballot in 1924 under the federal Indian Citizenship Act, no person in Montana was denied their right to vote on the basis of gender.

It's ironic that on this centennial anniversary of a step toward equal suffrage, your right to vote is under attack. This year, among the candidates and local issues, every ballot will contain two proposals referred to voters by the Montana Legislature. One of these legislative referenda threatens to revert state law back to a time when our families, friends and neighbors were handily denied access to the polls on Election Day.

Appearing on the ballot as LR-126, the proposal sets out to eliminate Election Day voter registration in Montana. Election Day voter registration has successfully secured voting rights for more than 29,000 Montanans since 2006 (that number increases when you include local elections). It's a good law that acts as a failsafe for any person who needs to register, change or update their information in order to vote in a statewide election. In fact, the majority of voters who use Election Day voter registration are hardworking Montanans who have recently moved across their county or the state and need to update their address in order to cast a ballot.


There is no reason to change a law that works, especially when that law secures your fundamental right to actively participate in our Democracy.

As you consider the choices on your ballot, consider all that has been accomplished to guarantee your right to vote. Let's work on solutions that increase turnout and enhance the overall integrity of elections in Montana. No state that has Election Day registration has ever taken that right away from the voters. Let's make sure Montana isn't the first state to do so.

Labor Day Enforcement Crackdown Adds Patrols to **Target DUIs**

Transportation One of the deadliest crimes committed in Montana may also be the most preventable. In Big Sky Country, the number of fatal crashes involving impaired drivers using alcohol and/or drugs continues to be nearly the highest in the nation. In an effort to eliminate this trend of high-risk behavior, law enforcement agencies across the state are participating in a national crackdown targeting DUI offenders.

The Montana Highway Patrol as well as city and county law enforcement agencies throughout the state are always on the lookout for drivers who show signs of impairment. During the weeks prior to Labor Day, August 13 through September 1, law enforcement officers statewide will intensify efforts to target drivers who appear to be impaired.

"Our experience tells us that we are very likely to see an increase in high-risk behavior from motorists during Labor Day weekend," said MHP District 1 Commander, Captain Jim Kitchin. "Instead of enjoying the last summer holiday before the weather changes, individuals who choose to drive while under the influence of drugs and alcohol may be spending their time elsewhere-in jail or the morgue."

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), more than 10,000 people die annually from injuries received during impaired driving crashesthat's one every 51 minutes. Motor vehicle crashes remain the leading cause of death for people under the age of 35 with a staggering economic impact of more than \$230 billion annually.

"If you plan on drinking during Labor Day weekend, be sure to designate a sober driver," said Kitchin. "With the additional officers out in force patrolling our roadways, chances are that if you choose to drink and drive, you will be caught and you will be prosecuted."

High-visibility enforcement is one of the overall strategies employed in Montana's Vision Zero, a multipronged initiative with the goal of eliminating deaths and injuries on Montana roads. Law enforcement patrols participating in extra patrols are funded by the Montana Department of Transportation. For more information, visit plan2live.mt.gov or #VisionZeroMT.





The thrill is in the air, calendars are out, enrollment is approaching and the school supplies are ready to be purchased! For many, it is a great time of year, but for others it is an anxiety-ridden ride for parents and children. There are many reasons back to school can be hard for a lot people.
